PRESIDENT'S REPORT

This season has been the worst season that I have encountered in my 62 SACA seasons as a player, Coach and Administrator. This is simply due to an unreasonable and illogical decision of the SACA Board to reduce the number of Clubs in the western suburbs of Adelaide. A decision made by people, most of whom have had no experience in Grade Cricket Administration. The decision caused an immense amount of work, stress and financial cost to the Club and its volunteers.

Lack of transparency, hidden agendas, lack of knowledge of Grade cricket administration and refusal to acknowledge the efficiency and future planning of the West Torrens District Cricket Club plus what it has achieved in its history and more importantly in recent times.

On December 7th I received a letter stating

That the West Torrens District Cricket Club has been one of the three Clubs under consideration by SACA not to compete in the first grade competition, effective from the commencement of the 2016-17 season.

and

there exist too many Clubs on the western seaboard, given the population projections and demographics and level of cricket engagement.

On the 29th February (an ominous date) Scott Jones prepared a wonderful presentation to the SACA Board of Management. Only Woodville and Port Adelaide besides ourselves were required to do so. NO OTHER CLUBS! Scott's presentation included the fact that we have won 40 Premierships in the past 14 seasons. West Torrens and Glenelg are the only Clubs to produce 5 home grown Test cricketers since World War 2. He mentioned the 8 players who played Test cricket while West Torrens players plus the 79 male and 8 female players who have represented South Australia as *Eagles*. He also mentioned the strength of our Women's cohort and our excellent Junior Development. This apparently fell on deaf ears and was all to no avail.

At a meeting between Maurie Vast (PACC President) Keith Bradshaw (SACA CEO) and myself on Thursday 2nd June the SACA Board of Management agreed to grant a deferral of any decision to relegate either of the West Torrens D.C.C. or the Port Adelaide C.C. to Premier 2nd Grade for season 2016-17 and that both Clubs would continue to play in the Premier 1st Grade competition and will receive a full SACA financial grant for the 2016-17 season. The first battle had finally been won.

This agreement committed us to continue merger discussions with the Port Adelaide Cricket Club. We have informed the SACA that this is only because because of its threat of withdrawal of all or a substantial part of any financial assistance. During our discussions Port Adelaide and West Torrens will also seek a quality and acceptable alternative to the removal of a Club from 1st Grade, to present to the Board of the SACA.

The on-going struggle has been arduous. I estimate that, during the past six months, there have been over 1000 emails 'to-ing and fro-ing', more than 200 phone calls and approximately 30 meetings to achieve the current position. I would very much like to thank those people involved. The task was just too great for one person. Thanks to our entire Board of Management and in particular our hard working sub-committee of Andrew Capel, Brenton Woolford, Scott Jones and Charlie Rumbelow and to Adam Rumbelow for the provision of statistics for Scott's Presentation to the SACA.

Our gratitude is also due to our Patron the Hon. Paul Caica M.P. through whose initiative a Parliamentary Select Committee has been set up to investigate the decision making of the SACA Board over this issue. Our solicitor and former President Ian Edgley has been a tower of strength in guiding us through the legalities which we encounter. Matt Williams M.P. has also raised the issue in Federal Parliament. We have had many calls and emails of support from the wider cricket community including our past players and the past players and officials of every other SACA Club (but not necessarily current Club officials).

A large debt of gratitude is due to my wife Noaline and the wives and partners of others who have strived so hard for success in this struggle. They have endured all of the extra hours which we have had to put into a struggle which didn't have to happen.

It has been a privilege to work with the Port Adelaide C.C. as they have stood shoulder to shoulder with West Torrens throughout and completely shared the burden. So many people have played their part in saving our great Club.

Arguments against the rationale of the SACA Board decision

- We disagree with the notion that the numbers don't support three Clubs in the western suburbs
- Currently Population and Demographics do not matter after age of 18 as Clubs can poach players from anywhere and therefore the numbers of Juniors transitioning to seniors do not matter (cf. University C.C.)
- SACA is considering removing junior zones. If so then Clubs can take their Juniors from anywhere in the state so again zones or number of 0-14 year olds in a particular area won't matter. However it will take the onus of Clubs developing juniors as each Club's zone will be the state borders.
- One of the reasons given in the Zadow Report for the reduction in the number of Clubs was the poor standard of Grade cricket. Over the last few seasons the standard has risen considerably (verified by SACA Board member Rod Phillips at the 1st Grade Grand Final) due to a number of factors. The marked improvement of South Australia's High Performance teams is testament to this.
- The bye is another reason given. Currently a large number of players do not mind the bye. In cricket's equivalent winter sport, the SANFL, Clubs have a number of byes.

We must continue to fight this battle to maintain our history and culture. Therefore we must keep united within the Club and with the Port Adelaide Cricket Club.

In last year's Annual Report I outlined the essential needs of any elite Club are

- talent I.D. followed by recruitment and development of the recruits
- income to exceed expenditure (business management)
- volunteers and/or remunerated workers
- obtaining and upkeeping suitable facilities

We have continued to do this but have received little credit. In the season just passed the Club has refurbished the sight screens so that now they revolve, displaying one white façade for red ball matches and the reverse side being black for white ball games. The bases are still the historical World Series screens from Football Park. The bowling machines now are portable and the centre square covers are able to be wound onto a roller.

We have instituted a Junior Girls Cricket Academy for talented 10-13 year olds with a State Government grant which our Patron the Hon. Paul Caica M.P. assisted us in procuring. Five of these girls actually played some games in the Women's 2nd Grade. 10 girls who have benefited from our Young Eagles Academies (Girls and Mixed) have now played senior cricket with West Torrens.

This season seven girls and five boys aged 18 or under played 1st Grade for the Club and the SACA wishes to remove a Club from our area because of a professed paucity of Juniors. The only problem that West Torrens has with Juniors is that some other Clubs, realising how development has advanced the skills of these players, are hovering to take easy pickings when they have been blooded in our seniors.

Eagle Day, a celebration of past players, officials and supporters was again very well attended. On that day we unveiled the *John Beagley Memorial Life Members Board* an outstanding piece of workmanship which we were only able to erect through the wonderful generosity of John's son Michael. Michael was unfortunately unable to attend the function but we thank him for his contribution.

We have again finished with an excellent credit balance. This is a great effort considering the work that had to be put into saving the Club from relegation reduced the time available to conduct fund raising events.

From anecdotal evidence West Torrens appears to have more volunteers than most Clubs. I thank all of you who have contributed in any way to the ongoing smooth operations of this the oldest continually operating cricket Club in South Australia.

The Board of Management, the Members of the various sub-committees, those great contributors who cater for Afternoon Teas throughout the Grades, those who score, the Managers and Umpires in the Junior Grades – to you we are extremely indebted – thank you! An extra special thank you to those parents who travel long (and costly) distances almost every weekend of the season so that their sons and daughters can have a chance at playing in the state's elite competitions. And to Michael and Annabelle Waugh from Greenock Creek Wines who contribute \$1000 per season to help our country players play for the Club.

The Club was happy to host two games in the Australian Under 19 Championships during December – the first between Western Australia and Tasmania and later a match between Tasmania and the Cricket Australia XI.. Also in January we successfully hosted several Country Cup matches, both Junior and Senior.

A very young First XI started the season with a win against Adelaide but failed to make further inroads on the Premiership. The 2nd, 3rd and 4th Grades were all finals aspirants at Christmas but the bombshell from the SACA which hit us at that time and the accompanying uncertainty of tenure, greatly stressed the young cohort and seriously affected their play. Consequently no senior Men's teams reached the play-offs.

We lost our Senior Coach Adam Rumbelow who had to resign for personal reasons in early January. Cricket Director Brenton Woolford took over as Senior Coach and was very ably assisted by Davis Bourn and Leigh Drennan. Special thanks for those who stepped in and did a great job holding things together. I would like to thank Adam for his 14 seasons of contributions both on and off the field at the Club. He was a member of Premiership teams A Grade (2006-07) B Grade (2002-03 and 2007-08) and Coach of Premiership teams Under 17 (2006-07, 2007-08, 2009-10 and 2010-11) and Under 16 Red (2005-06 and 2006-07) and in addition he has assumed a number of off the field roles.

The Senior Women's teams again showed their strength with the 1st Grade going down by 7 runs in the semi-final of the major 1st Grade competition and finishing in the top four of the T20 matches (top two only in the Final). The 2nd Grade which has nine of its players in the 10-17 age group plus three older experienced players, won both the 40 overs and the T20 competitions. The guidance of Lanni Winson (capt.) and former Test reps Caroline Ward and Tunde Juhasz has been invaluable. The leading wicket takers in the 2nd Grade were two 13 year olds from the country, Jess Cufone and Emily Hinze.

I would like to record my sincere appreciation to our host of volunteers (see Directory of Officials). In particular I would like to thank our Secretary **Charlie Rumbelow**. Charlie has been operating in an official capacity for the past 10 years as Team Manager, Data entry person and for the last two years as an energetic and extremely reliable Secretary. Charlie has now decided to retire from official duties. He has taken on many extra tasks as Secretary such as securing valuable grants for the Club, doing the odd jobs such as dismantling and erecting Honour Boards, transmitting his legendary fortnightly newsletters and doubling as the Home Ground Team manager when required.

I would also like to thank Brett Grove (Chairman) Julie Brown (Secretary) Marty Edmunds (Cricket Co-ordinator) Amy Agnew (Country Liaison and Child Protection Officer) and the Junior Committee for the excellent planning and implementing of the Junior Program. Sharon Harris has carried out a similar role (on her own) to implement the Women's Program. Thanks Sharon.

A special thanks to Latisha Polkinghorne and Allan Hutton who successfully and diligently managed the canteen, along with Richard and Jenny Williams and Peter Hutton, thus helping to contribute substantially to our income.

Both the Senior and Junior Presentation Dinners were again overwhelming successes – About 100 attended the Senior function and approximately 150 attended the Junior night. Reports indicate that everyone who attended had an enjoyable experience. Special thanks for the Senior Dinner must go to Andrew Capel M.C. Adam Rumbelow , power point presentation and Michelle Capel, Alan Hutton and Latisha Polkinghorne for organisation of venue, organisation of trophies, invitations, tying up loose ends, chasing up bookings etc.

And likewise Daryl Marshall who ‘M.C.ed’ the Junior Dinner and to Adam Rumbelow, again a great Power point presentation and Julie Brown, Tracy Croft and Daryl for the organisation of the new venue (Grange Golf Club), organisation of trophies, invitations, tying up loose ends, chasing up bookings etc..

It would be remiss of me not to mention the excellent work of Alan Hutton who contributed the major effort in obtaining sponsorship. Our sponsors have again been particularly generous this season – thank you so much. Without your support it would be difficult for a Grade Cricket Club to function. With your support we are able to put 18 teams on the park and help develop the sporting aims and enjoyment of many young women and men. Thus we are the only SACA Club fielding this many teams and one of only six SACA Clubs fielding a team in every SACA Grade. **The Club would appreciate our members both playing and non-playing and your friends continuing to support our Sponsors during the winter.**

Finally I would like to acknowledge Lauren Ebsary who has retired from State cricket. She recently led the Scorpions to victory in the Women’s National League thus winning the Ruth Preddey Cup for the first time in 20 years which is only the sixth time that South Australia has won the National title in its 80+ year history. The coach was former West Torrens Coach Andrea McCauley who had captained the previous National title victory. I have written a Special Profile of ‘Beeper’ in this report which I exhort you to read. The good news is that she will continue to play for the ‘*Eaglettes*’.

Once again we are indebted to our 84 non-playing members for supporting the Club. Your contributions really assist to keep the Western Eagles afloat in trying economic times. This season we had Our Blue and Gold/Golden Eagle Annual luncheon was held at Glenelg Oval this season during the South Australia v. Tasmania Sheffield Shield match. The reason for the continued change of venue from Adelaide Oval to Glenelg Oval was the absolutely exorbitant costs which the Stadium Management Authority quoted for us to dine at a Redbacks game at Adelaide Oval. Thanks to the Glenelg Football Club the event was again an outstanding success.

Please become a non-playing member if you can’t volunteer. Without volunteers West Torrens can’t exist and without financial members and sponsors the oldest continuously operating cricket Club in South Australia - West Torrens - can’t exist.

SECRETARY’S REPORT

This is my second report as Secretary of the Club. Unlike last year I do not have the pleasure of reporting overall playing success for the Club. This year our playing achievements were perhaps the poorest in several seasons. This can be attributed to the loss of most of our bowling attack in the first week of the season due to retirement or injury – and they didn’t return. We just couldn’t bowl other sides out! This, coupled with SACA over our heads, causing the Board of Management having to focus on things other than cricket performance. It also took toll on other things including our coaching staff. However, at the end of the season, of the three north western suburbs clubs, we came 10th in the Club Championship, Port Adelaide Cricket Club 11th and Woodville District Cricket Club 12th. The Club Championship has

been the barometer of where the Club is at. It gives a better perspective of the health of the Club. Many clubs put their efforts into winning the 1st Grade, inducing players to their side to detriment of the club providing junior development. This has occurred to WTDCC many times during the last three seasons. WTDCC have always taken a broader view, both of our responsibility to the club and to cricket as a whole. We have a policy to develop from within and promote juniors. This is likely to change given SACA's non-appreciation of how we operate. SACA don't see the benefits of this approach. SACA have identified WTDCC as needing to merge. This is regardless of the fact we have produced, since 2000, more Test and State players than any other club. WTDCC is the top club during that time in junior achievement. WTDCC has been proud of the contribution made to cricket and our efforts to promote and foster the game of cricket, but this has not been recognised by SACA. It has been a most distressing year for many of our club people who have gone out of their way to accommodate the needs of SACA. Additionally SACA has been less than frank with us. They have identified WTDCC to merge but will not produce the evidence on which they base their decision. SACA will not advise us of the constitutional power which provides them the ability to do this. SACA's processes have been of such concern a Parliamentary Select Committee has been established to investigate this sordid project. I look forward to presenting part of the WTDCC submission to the Select Committee.

SACA, in reaching their decision to require WTDCC to merge, have criticised WTDCC in the management of its affairs:

1. WTDCC lease of the Henley and Grange Memorial Oval.

I advise members we have a 5 x 5 year lease with the City of Charles Sturt (CCS). This lease is next renegotiated in 2018. Discussions have already taken place with the CSS and their advice is that the lease will be extended. The CSS are very happy with the manner in which we conduct ourselves.

2. WTDCC lease arrangement with the Henley Football Club (HFC).

Our arrangements with HFC are also on a 5 x 5 year basis. Again this is to be renegotiated in 2018 and I do not envisage any difficulties with these negotiations. We rent space from HFC to cover our needs. This allows HFC to use the clubrooms when we do not require it – in particular on Friday nights. This is reflected in the lease, which I submit is the envy of many other SACA clubs.

3. WTDCC Bar arrangements. According to SACA we do not have our own Bar and this is perceived as a negative. It would appear you need a swill mentality to exist. We have 13 persons qualified to serve under the Licensing Act Regulations. We conduct a modest bar led by HFC – given the age of many of our players and the fact that as a Good Sports Club the service of alcohol is encouraged to be minimal. WTDCC is very happy with the outcomes of our canteen/bar (see the Treasurer's Report for details) which has shown a profit of about \$11K.

In summary WTDCC does not have large structures such as grandstands to maintain. We pay to the CCS for the oval and training nets and to HFC for our share of the clubrooms and we pay our share of the running costs. As such WTDCC has perhaps the best financial structure of any of the SACA clubs. We are lean and mean! At the end of this financial year WTDCC has \$30k in the bank.

While on the subject of funds I advise we have continued our course of updating our playing equipment.

Sight Screens

WTDCC has had the sight screens entirely renovated. We retained the base and wheels with all other parts being new. The sight screens are now reversible, with white on one side and black on the other. It now takes about 5 minutes to move from white ball to red ball cricket – and more time to walk from one screen to the other than to make the actual adjustment.

Covers

The covers have been a source of complaint for several seasons. They are very large and they are very good. But they require about 10 persons to move. A covers roller has been made and now they can be rolled up – taking them off the oval surface.

Memorabilia Boards

The Life Members Board and the Player Achievement Boards have been completed – however, due to the renovations at HFC are at present in storage.

Hookes Pavilion

The paving of the Hookes Pavilion has been restored. The CSS has replaced the edging and the pavers that were loose.

Projects in the pipeline

WTDCC has applied for funds to enclose the entire Curators Yard in a large shed. Part funding has been approved, but more will be needed and the success of an Active Club application is yet to be known. This shed will be divided into an area for storage with the bulk to the curator needs.

Information Technology

Applications for the purchase of laptop computers continues so that WTDCC can provide scoring live. We are yet to get sufficient funding to provide each senior team this facility

I also bring to member's attention those volunteers, not part of the Board of Management, who have attended to the many other tasks, to produce a successful twelve months. In particular those associated with the conduct of the Club in sub-committee roles:

- juniors,
- women, and
- the many volunteers who have assisted with the conduct of our seniors.

The juniors and women have distinct sub-committees and both have functioned well to achieve positive results for the Club.

Our Zone Area of Yorke Peninsula has been a continued success, as has the introductory groups associated with the Club, Milo In2cricket and Young Eagles, the envy of many other clubs.

WTDCC has a commitment to having all coaches and managers appropriately trained. Considerable funds have been expended in ensuring this training continues, constantly upgrading the skills of persons associated with duties within the Club – particularly at junior level and our Women's Grade level.

WTDCC supports:

4 senior Men's grades / 2 senior Women's grades / 4 junior SACA teams plus Ray Sutton Shield, U.12 Cup and U17 BankSA sides.

We have three teams in the Western Suburbs Junior Cricket Association – U11 and U13. WTDCC provides Milo Into Cricket and has two Academies – A Boys and a Girls Young Eagle Academy (which other clubs are now introducing). WTDCC structures and focus on developing cricket for the club and for higher playing is second to none in this State.

Other areas of the management have also shown good results. The canteen, as mentioned above, with thanks to Alan Hutton and Latisha Polkinghorne, for the excellent result, management of the teams, including the team manager roles, and scoring activities, along with the actual "doing things", such as preparing the ovals, sight screens, conveying equipment, and the like. Afternoon Teas, particularly with games at home, has seen the Drew Family assume control of this and what has been achieved has presented the Club in a very favourable light.

In the Eagle Eye our President, Denis Brien, has listed those who volunteer. I invite you to examine the list as it is a long and comprehensive one. If your name is not there, consider volunteering in the coming season. I'm sure you will find volunteering at the Club a fulfilling and satisfying experience.

While we can always use more volunteers those who have assisted over the past 12 months have been a cohesive and hard working group with a variety of skills that have, I believe, supported the playing activities of the Club, to produce results which we can be justifiably proud.

The first grade side lost their regular skipper after only a couple of games so I have to start by giving a massive wrap to Jess Joseph and Brooke Harris who took up that mantle together and did a very admirable job. They both had a real desire to become better at the captaincy role on the field which made them a pleasure to coach. They were also incredibly hard working in an off field capacity in terms of ensuring we had enough players week in week out!

We did not have access to Lauren Ebsary as much as we would have loved to but when she does play she is a phenomenal asset both as a player and in a mentoring capacity. Lauren has just called time on her career with the Scorpions and she has been a shining example to so many young female cricketers who will look to replicate her achievements in future years. Well done Beep! She still managed 317 runs from her 7 innings for the Eagles in the one-day competition this year. Brooke Harris also highlighted her potential in the one-day competition, whilst Ange Treloar and Tait Mackrill were fantastic at the top of the order in the T20 competition.

The first grade bowlers toiled hard and this was largely led by Ellie Falconer who took 16 wickets for the year in the one-dayers, new recruit Ainslee Knight who was a handful in both the one day and T20 competitions, and rising star Laura Niejalke who took 7 wickets in the T20s.

The A grade girls missed out on playing in the T20 final by 0.6 of a point, finishing third on the ladder; and were bundled out of the one-day competition in the semi-final after finishing the season in fourth. A mighty effort by every one of the girls given we were often undermanned and understrength throughout the year. Many players will be better for the opportunities they received this year and the Eags will be back on top next season!

The second grade girls had a fairy tale year. They were winners of both the T20 and one-day competitions in a team that really has an amazing mix of former gun cricketers who are quite experienced and some very young up and coming

cricketers aged anywhere between 11 and 15 years old. One of these 'former' guns (she is most certainly still a gun) is Caroline Ward. I have to give a huge shout out to Wardy because she scored 304 T20 runs and 459 one-day runs. However, the things that statistics do not show is her leadership and influence over the West Torrens ladies as a group. She is a mentor, a guide and a coach to all the girls regardless of their age or ability and life would be a great deal harder for me as a coach without her involvement.

In the bowling department Jess Cufone was the leading wicket taker with 17 wickets in the one-day competition and 7 T20 wickets. The other special mention would go to Caitlin Edmunds who floated between both grades this year but continues to regularly improve in all disciplines.

My last mention would go to Lanny Winson who took the reigns as skipper of the second grade side this year and was equally as hardworking in terms of ensuring she had enough players every week, providing opportunities for the young players to gain invaluable experience during games, and also having a bumper year in her own achievements. YOUNG EAGLES GIRLS ACADEMY

We saw 16 girls from the ages of 8-15 year old participate from the western suburb schools and people who had heard about the free program. It ran for 5 weeks prior to Xmas and 5 weeks after Xmas. This included 2 weeks of games where the girls could put their skills learnt into practice against other club girls and have fun playing together as a group.

We were lucky to have two coaches at the sessions in Jess Joseph and myself and at different times, we had a few of the girls from both 1st and 2nd Grades lend a hand and take part which was a big help. This made sure the young ones as well as the mums and dads got to know some of the older girls before their young daughters went on to play with the Eagles throughout the year. All the girls who took part in the program walked away with a West Torrens cap and training shirt, and everyone looked the part!

In its first year our emphasis was on building the basic skills and having plenty of fun! We wanted to get out of the nets as much as possible and have girls work in pairs, batting off tees in small groups and there was minimal competition phase. The girls walked away learning the basics for a defence, cover drive, pull shot & sweep shots. In the field we had some natural athletes, and the main aim was to get a good throwing technique, ensure we all had a good gather point and of course throwing down the stumps and a good celebration with high 5s all round! In the bowling department Jess was able to give the girls some great tips in not only pace bowling but also the basic grips for both off spin and leg spin.

There was a great mix of girls that made up our academy, some that currently play for Grange CC who were playing with the junior boys. However most hadn't played and were looking for a program like this to learn the skills before taking the leap into our 2nd grade. Several travelled from country regions and there were 5-6 who then debuted for us throughout the year in the 2nd grade which was the perfect feeder program to top up our numbers in the club.

I'm sure debuting in our club was a highlight for many of them, as well as playing in our games as "The Young Eagles Girls Academy" at the end of the 10 week program where Jess and I organised opposing clubs to have a "friendly" with similar aged girls to play. It was a modified T20 game where all batters batted in pairs for 4 overs a pair and any wickets meant you gave away 5 runs to the opposition. The beauty of this meant the girls could continue to bat and enjoy themselves. All players also had a chance to bowl and rotated throughout all the fielding positions.

It was a great finish to the program and left the girls wanting more! Jess and I hope to see the same faces and more out again as we build on their skill set. This program has been a wonderful initiative that has come to fruition by our

President Rocka, and we thank him again for gaining the grant for us to be able to provide such an amazing opportunity for young girls to come and learn the skills before filtering through to our 2nd Grade. Thanks again Rocka, from all the mums/dads and Jess and I for being a part of this.

Lauren Ebsary was born, raised and educated in Snowtown in the mid north of South Australia. She began her cricket by playing on the back lawn of her parents farm with her competitive brother and as the patch of lawn was fairly small the only way to make her big brother chase it, was to hit it hard and aim for the down hill drive way that was 100 m. long! So all the training in the backyard, trying to clear the tall trees/shrubs and dodging the cats/dogs as fielders, gave her a grounding in the basic skills.

Whilst she was at high school, Australian all rounder Joanne Broadbent conducted a coaching clinic at Snowtown from which Lauren was invited to a SACA talent camp. Although she had never played a serious game of cricket she went to the Under 17 squad trials and was selected for SA. Consequently she needed to play competitive cricket and joined the Flinders University C.C. (now West Torrens) scoring a C Grade hundred early on.

On completing Year 12 Lauren moved to Adelaide permanently to study for the Diploma in Administration in Sport/Recreation and Tourism (Foundations of Human Resources) at Regency TAFE and for employment opportunities. While still 17 she debuted for the SA Scorpions in the Women's National League and then continued as a regular member of the state team for seven seasons until gripped by wanderlust.

A self confessed 'gypsy' who enjoys travel, Lauren went first to the Alice Springs and Uluru areas on a working holiday. Knowing that wasn't for ever she moved on to Perth for the next three years and played with the WACA Fury. During her first season she performed creditably as an all rounder and secured a spot in the Australian line-up. She debuted against India in ODIs in November 2008, was selected in the World Cup team and was a member of the Australian touring party to England in 2009. In just her sixth ODI she dominated the game against New Zealand in Hamilton (NZ) and devastated the bowling to such an extent that Australia compiled 4/307 from their 50 overs, her contribution being

86 from 76 balls. Her Test debut was at Worcester where she scored 3 and 21 and took 2/35 in England's first innings. During her initial year with Midland Guildford in the WACA she also played C Grade in the men's WACA competition.

After three seasons west of the border Lauren decided to return as she wanted to finish her playing career with SA and the lure of family was a big incentive to come home. The SACA had been contacting her each season that she was away and knowing that the Scorps had a very young team with a touch of the experience of Karen Rolton, Shelley Nitschke and Julie Woerner, Lauren felt that it was the right time to make a move.

Returning to SA she chose West Torrens as her Club after an approach from Denis Brien. She had played her early years with Flinders Uni and says she knew that women's cricket was in good hands at Henley Oval. She enjoys the banter at the *Eagles* and has been a most welcome and valuable acquisition to the Club.

On her return she told Rocka "To be around a group like we have in the Scorps is such a good buzz when you have raw talent, seniors, and the infectious fun factor - the balance at the moment is just about right and we proved on the (recent) weekend away in QLD what its like when we all play well." [Lauren scored 41 n.o. and 51 n.o. in the T20s and 37 in the 50 over format on that trip.]

Whilst Lauren has had many great experiences in her cricket career a very special moment and probably her biggest thrill was her home debut for Australia at the SCG in front of her parents. Her thoughts "I had been picked in the squad but was unsure if I was going to play a game, but for all the time/money spent on me as a young kid trying to play cricket, I thought it would be super just having my parents there to see me in the green and gold anyway!" Her Test debut was also very special as women don't get the opportunity to play Test cricket very often. Other highlights were being apart of a World Cup team on home soil in Sydney, her first wicket at Australian level against India in November at the SCG and scoring 202 no for West Torrens.

Many people have influenced her career but she won't go past her first ever cricket coach, Dean "Hockey" Hoskin from Snowtown - a cricket fanatic. From a very early age he took her under his wing and coached her on the Snowtown concrete pitch which had chunks taken out of the surface, standing half way down the pitch throwing golf balls while she had a stump practicing the pull shot. Another to rank high on her list is her former Western Australian coach Steve Philipee who always ensured she was allowed to play with freedom. A lot of people have helped along the way and Lauren has taken snippets from each coach and everyone who is happy to talk about her innings or bowling efforts.

Lauren's thoughts about the West Torrens Cricket Club after her first season back in South Australia were:

"I think the club has been really supportive of the merge with the Flinders Uni W.C.C. The group I have come back to has some of the young girls (with whom she started) now being seniors in the group, as well as a few new really exciting talents coming through in Ashley Eyles and Louella McCarthy who are two tearaways with talent to burn! The feel of the Club is very family orientated and really welcoming and it's great to see the young boys getting their chance on the 'mike' – it's always fun hear how they summarise the weekends games! With Rocka's passion, enthusiasm and humour things look like they are under good guidance with his team of supported family members and volunteers that put their time into building the club to what we have now - something that every club needs."

Last season Lauren led the Scorpions to victory in the Women's National League thus winning the Ruth Preddey Cup for the first time in 20 years which is only the sixth time that South Australia has won the National title in its 80+ year history. The coach was former West Torrens Coach Andrea McCauley who captained the previous National title victory. This season Lauren also coached the inaugural Young Eagles Girls Cricket Academy the first of its kind in the state.

Lauren Ebsary is an outstanding cricketer, a Test player, a World Cup representative, an excellent leader, a great Club person and above all a wonderfully warm, kind and sensitive person.
