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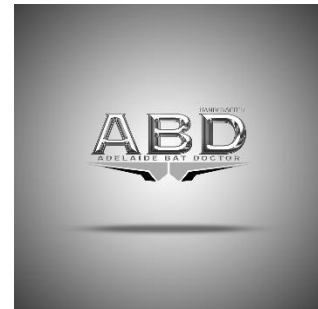

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

To say a lot has happened since the end of the 2019/20 cricket season would be somewhat of an understatement. However the WTDCC has seemingly navigated the last 18 months amazingly well and we are in a great position to be able to really build towards being a one of the top few Premier clubs in SA.

Season 20/21 was a year in which we got back to the finals in both the Men's 1st & 2nd grade two-day comps as well as making finals in 3 of the 4 Women's competitions and the Men's U18 Shield. With such comparatively young squads and outstanding talents coming through, we believe this is the start of some highly successful years on the field. We have already added four major talents to our men's squad in past juniors Harry Nielsen (back from Woodville) and Kelvin Smith (back from Wanneroo, WA) in addition to Victorian quick Jordan Buckingham and NSW leg spinning allrounder Daniel Fallins. This will make spots in our 1st Grade harder to earn and will mean our next crop of players will need to work even harder, pleasingly this is something that many have already started to do. The Women's Committee are also trying hard to land a couple of exciting new players too.

Wes Thomas, former player & David Hookes Medallist, has recently stepped in to provide some extra batting coaching to our senior playing squad. We look forward to youngsters Erik Carrington (who registered his highest 1st Grade score last year), Lachie Pointon (who was the major factor in our T20 win against ND) and Nick Crouch (who along with captaining the 2nd Grade to back-to-back semi-finals, also contributed solidly with the bat in the latter half of the season), continuing to improve and provide Hags with headaches at the selection table. We also have several fast bowlers ready to take the next step and I'm sure if they can work hard in the offseason and continue on, the likes of Brady Williams (1st grade debut last year), Lucas Gammon (who added a number of 1st Grade games to his tally), Tom Kennewell (played his initial T20 1st Grade games last year) and James Reuther (1st Grade debut) will give us plenty options in addition to our more established first grade players.

Season 2020-21 saw the completion of 3 massive infrastructure projects, with the help of Henley Football Club, Federal, State & Local governments as well as donations and countless volunteer hours. The new training facility, new lighting & new changerooms will mean that West Torrens is a club that will continue to be at the forefront of Premier cricket in SA. A big thank you to each person who helped in any (large or small) way, without any one of you the projects would not have been possible. Almost \$1.5m has been spent over the past 12 months! It was a great thrill to be able to name our part of the new changerooms after one of our Life Members, *Sheagle* Lauren Ebsary and we look forward to making our home full time from next summer. We also got to test out the new lights with a series of Internal Junior squad games in the last week of last season.

We joined with new charity partner in Foodbank SA and helped supply needy South Australians with food via a can drive which incorporated a cookoff in the clubrooms early

in the season. A group of volunteers from West Torrens and our sponsor, Ous Property, also helped by packing hampers at Foodbank headquarters at season's end.

During the year, the Board decided to name a Number One Ticket Holder, which deservedly went to club legend Brian Isaac. We also took a step to acknowledging some past players & administrators who had gone onto bigger and better things, often away from the cricket field, by announcing a group of Ambassadors. The newly named Ambassadors have already started to help the club with some fundraising, a couple attended the annual trophy night and presented awards, while others have given a helping hand in the recruitment of some potential players.

Our inaugural School Holiday Elite Cricket Clinic was held. It catered for players from our junior teams/academy and saw 22 of our keenest juniors participate in a two-day clinic run by Mark Harrity & Coaching Director Brenton Woolford at the Kidman Park Indoor Sports Centre. Players received written &/or video feedback and participated in drills specific to their needs/abilities, topped off with some ridiculously competitive games to end the sessions. The participants were lucky enough to have Australian squad players Travis Head & Alex Carey "Zoom" in to chat about their experiences and had a visit from Strikers & West Torrens fast bowler Spencer Johnson. A second clinic will be held mid-July and we plan to find a time during the busy Xmas holidays to run another.

In our junior coaching ranks, we are welcoming back past players James Minagall and Simon Kreig who will head up our Junior Coaching Team (U16/14s) and they will be helped by Sam Ellicott in a new Junior Development role. We are sad to lose the "full time" services of Liam Dorward (U16s coach) but hopefully we still see him regularly at the club and we thank him for his fine efforts over the years.

Unfortunately, Latisha Polkinghorne will step aside from her expansive role as Bar Manager, Players Tea Coordinator, Canteen Operator and generally chief of most operations inside the clubhouse from sunup to well after sundown during the cricket season. A big thank you to 'Tish and we look forward to those who will step into those roles providing the same commitment to the club that she has over the past (give or take) decade.

Sadly, Latisha is not the only member of our players tea/bar crew that we will see less of next year with First Grade Scorer & Team Manager Richard Williams also taking time out to try his hand at cricket umpiring. We wish him all the best and we hope to see him around the club to help support his son & Club Treasurer, Ben, with his on-field endeavours whenever possible. The club won't be the same without Latisha & Richard and it will require a number of people to step up and help fill those roles. Once again, if you have an interest or expertise that you think we could use, please don't be afraid to put up your hand and join a very strong volunteer group to help the WTDCC players achieve all they can for next year and beyond.

Lastly, congratulations to all the trophy winners from last year, it was fantastic to be able to celebrate them in person at the club (juniors) and the WWT Eagles FC (seniors, thanks

to Alan Hutton for his organisational skills and Latisha & the Capel's for ensuring a brilliant event) and let's look forward to another great summer in 2021/22.

TREASURER'S REPORT and BALANCE SHEET

The financial statements for the club for the year ended 30 April 2021 are set out on the following pages and show a net profit of \$11,528 compared to \$11,314 last year. On adding back the depreciation expense of \$9,042 the club recorded an operating profit of \$20,570. To achieve this result despite the challenges thrown at us by COVID is a great effort by all involved at the club.

Some of the significant income and expense results for 2021 are as follows:

- The main thing that will stand out on the profit and loss is the grants income of \$85,910, as well as the significant increase in Grounds & Maintenance expense up to \$121,508 from \$43,187 the previous year. The grants were acquired by the club to assist with the payment of the huge upgrades to our facilities. Early in the season our training nets were completely redeveloped into a first-class facility which will be able to be enjoyed by all grades for many years to come.
- Canteen and Catering generated a profit of \$8,787 which is largely due to the great efforts of Latisha, who has spent many hours helping the club behind the bar over the years. These results, which help the club massively, would not be possible without her. There are too many others to name, but thank you to everyone else who volunteered their time over the year to help the club behind the bar. It is greatly appreciated.

Financial Position

As at 30 April 2021 the club's net assets sat at \$176,517 compared to \$164,989 the year before, proving the club remains in a strong financial position moving forward. Our total cash at bank as at 30 April 2021 was \$34,297. You will notice the addition of the Changerooms in the Assets section of the balance sheet. This represents the club's contribution to the brand new changerooms which are shared with the Henley Sharks Football Club. This is another fantastic addition to the club's facilities which will also be able to be enjoyed over many years. The large increase in creditors relates to funds that were owing at year's end for our contribution to the new changerooms. This has since been paid and the club's financial position remains strong.

After a successful year for the club on and off the field, we will be looking to build on this in the coming year. With several player and coaching recruits, as well as the new facilities and strong financial position, the future is looking very bright for the club.

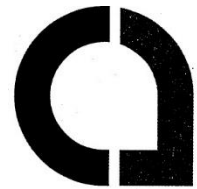

Assurance Practitioner's Responsibilities

My responsibility in undertaking this review is to express a conclusion on the financial reports.

SENIOR MEN'S CRICKET

In 2020-21 our club showed good improvement winning four more games in both first and second grade respectively than the previous season, this resulted in both teams playing in the Semi-finals. Ryan Gibson proved to be an outstanding addition to the club both as a player and a clubman with over 500 runs at 83 and Pat Fisher made 393 at 65 in a very good effort and Tom Sibley made his first hundred in first grade. Ryan was rewarded with a full contract with the Redbacks for 2021/22. Bailey Capel showed outstanding development making 652 runs at 65.2 and as a result earned a SACA Rookie contract for this coming season. Daniel Drew had a very good year as a bowler taking 27 wickets and Spencer Johnson 22 wickets.

Our second grade also was consistent this year resulting in a finals appearance after Covid stopped this occurring in season 2019-20. We have a very promising crop of young players coming through, the depth of our first grade team will be improved this year with the recruitment of highly promising young players, **Jordan Buckingham** (a fast bowler from Victoria who has taken 46 wickets in the last 2 seasons in Melbourne Grade Cricket) and **Daniel Fallins** (a leg spinner from New South Wales who has taken over 200 grade wickets in Sydney and made a Grade hundred) together with the return to the club of **Kelvin Smith** who has returned to us from an outstanding season in WA and **Harry Nielson** who comes back to us with a rapidly developing career in First Class cricket and a significant record in Grade cricket. At the time of writing James Reuther who played his first A grade game last season as a talented 16-year-old has been selected in the SA Under 19 squad which is exciting news for our club.

Our batting this year reflected a real development in maturity in the club with 12 centuries in the 4 grades and we have really appreciated Brad Young's valuable input as our batting coach. This coming season Trent Kelly will provide coaching support with the bowling for Hags and Youngy, which given his outstanding playing profile over many years in both First Grade and First Class cricket, and as a person with strong leadership capacity adds enormous value to the club. We thank David Bourne for his valuable contribution to our coaching group over a number of years. Manning McInerney is going to focus on the women's group this year which given his busy professional career should enable him to better prioritise his work in our club. He has already made a significant contribution to our club, and we look forward to his continued involvement at West Torrens. Investment in our young players and coaches continues to be a major priority with the development of improved coaching to the group of 15 to 19 year old players transitioning to the senior group.

These are exciting times for the club, the defining of our playing culture through our coaching group and the commitment and leadership of our players will be a critical part of our success in this coming season. We look forward to our membership getting behind our players to create the ultimate success again for our club.

SENIOR WOMEN'S CRICKET

The success of the WTDC Women's program can be seen as 3/4 semi-finals appearances between our two grades, along with the positive exposure of young talent into our 1st Grade during the One Day competition. Our depth was seriously tested during an unforeseen injury crisis, with 7 players experiencing season ending or long-term injuries at different times of the year. Players such as Mackenzie McCauley and Claire Harvey were stand out debutants through weight of runs and wickets, while players like Charlie Henderson-Whitehead and Caiomhe Roche made their debuts to experience the next level and reward loyalty to their peers.

While the young have had their first taste, we have been fortunate to welcome back multiple club legends who have helped out the club again in our times of need.

On field, 3 out of 4 semi-final appearances shows that we have a group with strong character despite our injury concerns. Tahlia McGrath who was outstanding, scoring over 30% of the 1st Grades runs in both formats, along with Amanda-Jade Wellington were so crucial for our young group when not required by the Adelaide Strikers or SA Scorpions. The return to form of Angela Treloar (271 runs @ 24.63) was important to our 1st Grade group as she took on a new role in the middle order, along with the responsibility taken on by Paris Hall (338 runs @ 22.53) as a regular 1st Grade opening batter. Kayla McGrath has grown exponentially as a 1st Grade keeper of class and is showing meticulous preparation to her skill. Maggie Clark was outstanding for the 1st Grade this summer, as a 14-year-old fast bowler, she has been mature and skilful beyond her years and is a special talent for this club. Jess Joseph was once again supported by the metronomically Emily Parsons and Amanda Wellington. Our captain Jess Joseph (18 wickets @ 25.55) once again had a solid season and continually shows she is the heart and soul of the West Torrens Women's program. Not only as the on field 1st Grade leader, but also as a role model for all of our girls in what it means to be a great club person, doing everything under the sun to make sure that the girls have everything they need.

Congratulations to the 2nd Grade and the success that they have experienced this year. As a team that is different every week, to play in 2 semi-finals was a special achievement. They were led well by Brianna Cheetham and Sy Massey, who has nurtured the group and provided an environment for the players to achieve their best. Brianna once again dominated with the bat, supported by the legend Caroline Ward. Claire Harvey was a standout, leading the bowling with Mackenzie Macauley, 'Charlie' Henderson-Whitehead and Jemma Torsney, all developing into fine cricketers.

Off field, the culture that has formed amongst the group has been something quite special. Whether that be the laughter at training, or banter at team dinners, our squad plays for each other and enjoys each other's company. They treat each other not only with respect, but also all others and opposition, resulting in the well-deserved 'SACA Spirit of Cricket Award' for this season.

Thank you to Sy Massey for your dedication to our developing players and your willingness to learn. Lawrence Joseph behind the iPad and scorebook has and always will be a great support, going along with his business quietly and methodically, thank you. A huge thank you to Gerard Treloar for your work as team manager, doing all tasks that make the players experiences on game day that much easier. Thank you to the McCauleys in the 2nd Grade for scoring and assisting Sy in any way needed.

This year, with our injury worries, player availability and an international pandemic, has been a team effort to make sure we have players on the ground, but the person who brings it all together is Nicole Parsons. She was special this year in organising clearances, organising uniforms and calling potential players, whilst also organising her own children for their games. Nicole we cannot thank you enough. Thank you to Denis Brien and all members of the Women's Cricket Committee, President Kent Sandy and the Board of Management for the tireless work and support of the Women's program.

Our season could have looked quite different without the injuries we experienced, and had we won our Semi-Final versus Sturt DCC, our momentum could have continued for the rest of the summer. Season 2021/22 is shaping up to be an exciting one, with recruitment and preparation having already begun.

JUNIOR CRICKET REPORT

The 2020/21 season saw lots of investment in depth of junior players and we continued to build our integrated coaching structure for WTDCC. We enjoyed the use of brand new hard wicket and turf net facilities and toward the end of the year fielded some junior development games at night under new lights – these opportunities will now become an integral part of our junior program. The Club also unveiled the new Unisex Clubrooms.

Over the past 3 seasons the Club has focused on transitioning the graduating U16 juniors into seniors and the result of this is strong retention of junior players in senior grades from the past 2 years. The lower senior grades now have a depth of juniors looking to continue their cricket journey with WTDCC seniors to improve themselves and the Club. This is evident with some success from our U18 Team who competed in the Semi Final at Karen Rolton Oval in January and defeated some strong Clubs on the way (including Adelaide CC who won the competition). This approach will continue and more new initiatives will further support personal development of young WTDCC players as they step up to play with and against the men.

To say depth was tested in the Under 16s is an understatement. With a few players absorbed by the Senior Grades to fill needs in those sides (e.g. 15yo Ollie Ellicott made Senior Team of the Year), and many U16 players required to play First XI for their schools, we effectively had to source the equivalent of a third U16 team. In the early rounds we fielded teams with only 4 players having previous U16 experience. But where there are

challenges, there are opportunities - all the boys improved and some exceptional results were produced, with Sean Feleppa having an outstanding season with the bat in both the U16s and as an under-age player in the U18 Competition. The U16 Reds were led with composure by Sam Turner who stepped into the U16 age group as an under-age Captain. Nathaniel Forby led the U16 Whites and was well rewarded with SACA's U16 Whites Bowling Aggregate with 24 wickets. Both Reds and Whites Teams showed great character and while they won enough games to finish around mid-table, were also very competitive against some of the stronger teams and could easily have finished higher up the ladder.

The Under 14s Reds were competitive all year but fell short of finals. One highlight was in Round 2 when Ryan Paul 111 (139 b.) and Jack Cook 78 (116 b.) came together with their team in trouble at 5/40 and compiled a 190 run record partnership to post an imposing total of 5/230. Archie Robertson had a fantastic season with the ball taking 24 wickets and winning the SACA U14 Reds Bowling Aggregate as an under-age leg spinner. In the Whites, we rotated a few boys with some experience through the team that was largely comprised of under-aged developing players competing against older and bigger opposition. This exposure to the level produced some sharp development in the boys who will retain what they learned and be back a year older and bigger to ensure competitive U14 teams will take the field in 2021/22. The Ray Sutton Shield Team with a new coaching group produced some excellent cricket in patches but weren't able to sustain it consistency enough, finishing with just the 1 win from 4 games before COVID-19 finished our competition prematurely.

Overall, while all our junior teams played some excellent cricket, the ongoing challenge for players, their coaches and team managers will be to produce this standard more consistently, carry it through complete games, individuals understanding and playing their roles in tighter teams and sustaining it from week to week.

Thanks to all our Coaches, Support Coaches and Team Managers and everyone who volunteered in any capacity through the season, especially with the barriers and complications resulting from the COVID-19 pandemic. A special thank you to Liam Dorward who has coached and mentored our Under 16 players for several years - well organised and highly respected, Liam leaves the role to focus on his studies and working career, and maybe he'll be able to play some cricket himself.

Welcome back to former players James Minagall and Simon Kreig who join the 2021/22 integrated coaching structure which is presented below and illustrates the pathway for players from WTDC Young Eagles Academy to Senior Ranks and beyond.

This year we had some younger coaches begin to contribute to the club by coaching within the program. The Ray Sutton program involves a selection process identifying talented young cricketers who then participate in a program building a basis which enables these juniors to then become part of the Ray Sutton Shield program and the SACA Under 14 programs. Over many years these young players have participated in games against other clubs which provides them with the opportunity to test their skills in a game situation against similarly talented young players from other clubs. This is an integral part of the program in providing the opportunity for these young players to be challenged.

The previous record, which was 238 by **Les Gooden** (162) and **George Parks** (94) v. Glenelg at Hindmarsh Oval in November 1911, had stood for 109 years.. This was also George Parks' A Grade debut – aged 17y. 121d.

Ange Treloar, who began with the *Sheagles* in October 2008 is fast approaching the milestone for the first West Torrens player to play 100 games. She had reached **99** 1st Grade 50 over games at the end of the season. She has also played 76 T20 matches. Educated at Blackfriars Priory School and Marryatville H.S. Callum began his cricket with the Prospect Club but at the beginning of the 2008-09 season decided to further his career at Henley Oval because of the playing facilities, the club culture and the depth of the playing stock. Since his transfer to the *Eagles* he has represented Australia in all three forms of international cricket.

After a number of excellent years in SACA Junior team, he was chosen to enter the Cricket Australia Centre of Excellence in 2002 and was then chosen for the Under 19 World Cup in Bangladesh in 2004. Unfortunately a severe knee injury in a lead up match at Eden Gardens in Kolkata kept him from playing.

A few more successful A Grade seasons with the *Pirates* helped him make his Pura Cup (Sheffield Shield) debut against Victoria at Adelaide Oval in October 2004 scoring 2 and 46. It was a phenomenal debut season for Callum as he headed the SA First class Batting Aggregate and Average with 733 runs at 38.57. In December of that season, after a duck

in South Australia's disastrous first innings against New South Wales at the SCG, when a devastating spell of 7/4 from Nathan Bracken dismantled the Redbacks for a record low 29, he bounced back with a maiden First class century in the second innings. He followed up with another later in the season against WA at the WACA. and also finished second in the One Day Aggregate behind Greg Blewett. A further solid season in 2005-06 when he scored 506 runs saw him consolidate his position and be one of the 15 players selected in the Australian First Class Cricket Academy. However in the next season his form declined at state level and he lost his First class place but he regained it in 2007-08 and scored 498 runs in eight games.

During the 2008 Australian winter he was appointed as Club Professional at the Netherfield Cricket Club in Cumbria UK and which plays in the Northern Premier League. Again Callum was a stand-out contributor scoring 1381 runs @ 106.23 - an aggregate 192 runs higher than the previous best set by South African Pierre De Bruyn in 2005. Regarding himself still as a fringe state player he transferred to West Torrens because of the Club's superior facilities, depth and general culture. His club appearances have been limited due to Redbacks commitments but did score a sparkling 48 n.o. in the outright win in his Club debut match against his old club Prospect, when he also he opened the bowling and took 2/19.

2008-09 was the renaissance season for 'Ferg'. In November he recorded his first one day domestic century. 101 from 83 balls v. Western Australia at Adelaide Oval before being eventually run out. He had turned the corner in this form of the game. He was called into the Australian ODI squad due to the absence of Ricky Ponting and Shaun Marsh, made his One Day International debut against the Kiwis at the MCG in February 2009 with a modest unbeaten 6 runs from 6 balls. He followed up with 28, 13 not out and an unbeaten 55 from 35 balls in a rain-shortened match, participating in an unbeaten partnership of 98 runs with keeper Brad Haddin. 'Ferg' completed the series with 102 runs from 75 balls with only one dismissal.

However great disappointment was to follow as originally named in the 30-man T20 World Cup squad (England June 2009) he was cut from the final 15. However he called into the ODI squad against England at the end of the 2009 Ashes tour when he received his first *Man of the Match* award with a superb 71 n.o. from 75 balls at The Oval. He followed with more useful knocks culminating the series with an Aggregate of 192 at 64.00 and a Strike Rate of 93.



Following the stint in England 'Ferg' was chosen for the ICC Champions Trophy series in South Africa, a series in which he had mixed success. Batting at numbers five or six he was rarely called upon to contribute in the lead up matches due to the strong top order and did not get to the wicket in either of the finals. The Grand Final played at Centurion Park on 5 October 2009 against New Zealand, was a memorable match for the young tyro as he was part of the victorious team but had the misfortune to rupture his anterior cruciate ligament in the same knee which he had damaged in Kolkata, thus requiring another re-construction.



He returned to cricket in September 2010 representing South Australia in the T20 Champions League in South Africa when he scored 200 runs at an average of 50.00 and with a Strike Rate of 152 and top scored in South Australia's losing semi-final with 71 from 49 balls.

Callum was then selected in the squad for the 2011 OD World Cup played on the sub-continent, but Australia was eliminated in the quarter finals before 'Ferg' got to play a match. From this point 'Ferg' struggled to be noticed by the Australian selectors. He scored a number of F/c centuries, was part of South Australia's drought breaking (25 years) One Day Ryobi Cup win and in 2012-13 was named in the Sheffield Shield and Limited Overs ACA Teams of the Year. He was also selected for Australia 'A' in a quadrangular tournament in Darwin involving India A, South Africa A and the National Performance squad. In 2013-14 he was again recalled to the Australia OD squad but didn't play a match. In 2015-16 'Ferg' continued to haemorrhage runs scoring his highest F/C score of 213 v. Tasmania sharing a 378 run partnership with Jake Lehmann. Unfortunately when training with Melbourne Renegades he severely injured his knee for the third time which ended his season.

By now the Australian selectors were beginning to take off their blindfolds and he was selected to make his Test debut v. South Africa at Bellerive in November 2016. Unfortunately 'Ferg' was run out by a direct hit from substitute fielder Dane Vilas when attempting a second run. He fared no better in the second innings and was unceremoniously dumped, as the whim of Australian cricket selectors, for a sparsely performed New South Welshman, Nick Maddinson, who fared no better making a duck, but was given three tries. Former Test players Brett Lee and Mike Hussey regarded 'Ferg' as particularly unlucky to be discarded after just one opportunity.

He was again named captain of S.A.'s JLT One Day Cup squad in 2017-18 guided the Redbacks to the finals when he blasted 169, his highest OD score for S.A. squeeze out a narrow win against W.A. in the final minor round game. He then handed back to the

returning Travis Head for the Finals but unfortunately the Redbacks crashed to lose the Grand Final by 6 wickets.

In May 2018 'Ferg' was a late call up for Worcestershire Rapids in the English county Royal London Cup One Day comp as a replacement for Travis who was required for national duty. His debut was one of seismic proportions when he slammed 192 from 143 balls, his and the Rapids' highest OD score, when chasing Leicestershire's 376 at New Road, Worcester. He proceeded to score another century in the following match and despite only appearing in five matches was the Rapid's second highest aggregator averaging 94, He was invited to return as a First-class player the following season to become the County's 26th Australian player.

During his outstanding career for the Redbacks, Callum won the Neil Dansie Medal in 2014-15 and the Lord Hampden Trophy in 2013-14 and 2014-15. In addition he has achieved much in the BBL and the IPL. But they are stories for another day.

In his final First class game v. Queensland at Glenelg Oval, the elegant right-hander was stoic and unbeaten on 11 in a Redbacks first innings collapse. However in his final innings he played a typical knock before he was l.b.w. (to a decision which many an umpire would have given the benefit of the doubt) for 97. A memorable finale – scrapping to the end.

Callum James Ferguson has now retired from First class cricket where he was always regarded as a strong and formidable competitor but he has always combined this with a cheerful and warm disposition. 'Ferg' is a quality human being who is both valued and respected by team-mates and friends. Although he is lost to First class cricket we hope that he still has many more seasons 'in the tank' at the *Eagles*.
