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PRESIDENT'S REPORT

West Torrens is a cricket club that prides itself on being one of the top Premier Cricket Clubs in SA. Season 2021-22 will go down as another very successful season with us achieving important victories both on & off the field. Obvious to all is the success achieved by our Men's 1st Grade squad, which under the guidance of Mark Harrity, Brad Young, Sam Ellicott, Brenton Woolford and the rest of the coaching and management team, won both the One Day & coveted Two-day titles.

In fairness to the other clubs in the competition, the 11 players who took to the field for both grand finals were as good a collection of First Grade cricketers that had been assembled in recent history. A fantastic mix of young up and coming talent, hardened professionals and committed clubmen who took great pride in representing our club and were striving to achieve success. With the best coaches of the level at the helm, it would have been somewhat disappointing to not have taken away some silverware from the season.

A special thank you to Ryan Gibson, who has notified of his move back to his home state of NSW with wife Lauren (& soon to be first born). His input to this club will be measured positively for many seasons to come. Inevitably there will be others who have played their last game for the club, we wish them well with their future endeavours both on & off the field and thank them for their contribution.

Some successful appointments have been made since this time last year with past player James Minagall stepping into the role of U16s coach, his impact has been important, and he will continue with even more vigour for season 22/23. Mark Whenan has been appointed Junior Coordinator for the coming year and the trio of Daniel Murdoch, Sy Massey & Jess Joseph have been appointed to head up the women's coaching team for 22/23 after a very successful "trial" period in the latter half of the year. However, we are on the lookout for an U14 coach for the coming season so please make yourself known if you know of anyone who may fill that vacancy.

Whilst working through some of the latter ramifications, the COVID-19 pandemic was at times tricky, especially on field post-Christmas. As a club we think we have come through this period relatively well. While our financial position is far from "commanding" we are managing to push our cricket programs forward even with the greater struggles through reduced funding from SACA (CA) & the ACA, thanks to a lot of hard work by several people in the club. Grants, player subs, bar & canteen takings are crucial income streams and while we still have a relatively healthy membership & sponsorship base, we are always looking to increase those so if you are considering a non-playing membership or have a business that is looking for a new partnership, please contact us and we would love to have you on board.

Our Academy program is going from strength to strength with already 40 players committed for the 2022/23 season. Mark Harrity & Brenton Woolford will continue to head our Academy and we hope to have most of last year's assistant coaches back again. We will need to bolster the coaching staff once more which is a great thing for both the junior players, our club and the senior players involved. An exciting offshoot is that we will welcome Sydney batting guru Neil D'Costa across to work with a range of our players from the Academy players (as well as older juniors, and seniors right up to some of our first grade) during the July School holidays. Neil is renowned for his work with players such as Labuschagne, Clarke, Hughes & Starc.

There are some exciting developments with some new players who will be joining the club before the start of next season but in fairness to those involved, we will keep them under wraps for now. It would, however, be fair to say that our men's 1st Grade bowling stocks will be bolstered, and we hope to have a player who can help counteract the loss of Gibbo in the batting line up. We also look forward to some of our U16 players making the step up to senior

men's cricket in the coming months as well as continued improvement from our young girls in our Women's program.

For now, there's still more work to be done in gearing up for next year, but thankfully, as well as a chance for the club to reflect on our most recent two-day men's Premiership, we held a reunion for those involved in all of our past 1st Grade Premierships at the Lockleys hotel (Club Major Sponsor) on May 28th.

Once again there is a move by SACA to make some changes to the current men's Premier Grades. As that advice has only recently been received and the club is in the process of taking in that information and making our assessment on what that may, or may not mean going forward, all I can say at this point is that we are in a strong position, much stronger than just about any time in our History, to be part of a move to make SA men's cricket more competitive at the pointy end. Whatever the outcome, we look forward to continuing in being a great place for talented cricketers to play, learn & improve their craft, from our most junior players right up to those playing for SA (& Australia) in all formats for both men & women.

TREASURER'S REPORT

The financial statements for the club for the year ended 30 April 2022 are set out on the following pages and show a net profit of \$4,287 compared to \$11,528 last year. Although there was a slight decrease in the net profit for the 2022 season, it is still a great sign that the club has been able to come out of another COVID affected year in a solid financial position.

Most of the club's income and expenses remained consistent with the previous season. The total income and expenses are significantly down on prior years which was to be expected as the 2021 figures were heavily boosted by the turf nets redevelopment, and the grants income we received to assist with this. You will notice in the profit and loss the sale of one of our old rollers. The proceeds were put towards a much-needed new roller, which Trent Kelly assisted the club in securing.

The club was still able to generate a solid canteen profit of \$4,233. There were big shoes to fill given the departure of Latisha Polkinghorne at the end of the 2021 season, but Chairman/Bar Manager Paul Sibley did an excellent job serving countless beverages during the season, especially during our Premiership celebrations. Special thanks to Peter Hutton, Catherine Terry, and everyone else who helped out behind the bar during the season. COVID put an end to some great function ideas from Jess Joseph, Callum Agnew and the rest of the social committee, so hopefully in the upcoming season these will be able to come to fruition and generate further funds to put back into the club. As at 30 April 2022 the club's net assets sat at \$180,804 compared to \$176,517 the year before, proving the club remains in a strong financial position moving forward.

After an extremely successful year for the club on the field, there are some exciting times ahead. It would be great to see our sponsorship income rise over the next season through player sponsors, as well as the continued support of the club's social functions and Presentation nights. This will ensure the club continues to thrive on and off the field for many years to come.

AUDITOR'S REPORT



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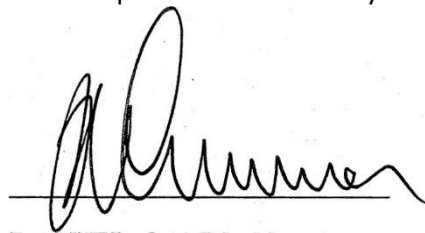
Assurance Practitioner's Responsibilities

As a club we are looking to further develop the quality of our group by developing a leadership program for our young players which we will be integrating with the 'Growing with Gratitude' program with our players, from early in the preseason onwards in 2022/23 with the program's leader – Ash Manuel. As a club we need to continue to exhaust ways in which we can develop the capacity of the people who represent our cricket club. This program presents an exciting opportunity for our players and coaches.

WOMEN'S CRICKET REPORT

It was a season of development for our 1st grade women, with injuries, covid, WBBL and state commitments forcing us take to the field with some very youthful sides. Despite some challenges, as every side this season has had, we remained competitive week in and week out, with numerous players earning themselves 1st Grade debuts through consistent performances in the 2nd Grade.

This season saw a big shift in the Women's squad, The structure, commitment and professionalism set by the coaching squad trickled down into the playing squad. We had players committed to 2 trainings a week, having extra coaching, training with a level of commitment to the squad and conducting themselves on and off the field with a level of maturity we had not seen for a long time.

This in turn grew our numbers as a squad exponentially, getting more girls to training than we can see names on 2 fields on a Sunday. This is where we saw a display of the brilliant club culture we have built over the seasons. **Cadence Murdoch** is a brilliant example of this. Cadence (who was in Grade 6 at the start of the season) despite being one of the leading wicket takers, took to being rotated out of the 2s with maturity and a team first attitude when donning the yellow vest and running drinks and warming up with the 2nd and 1st Grades.

A breakout season for young Jamestown born **Maggie Clark**, in her first full 1st Grade season. At just the age of 14 Maggie has been impressive with both the ball and in the field, earning her the Joanne Broadbent 1st Grade Fielding Trophy presented at the Bradman and Rolton Award night. **Kelly Armstrong** in her first season with the Eagles has led the way numerous times with both bat and ball, being economical and consistent across the T20 and one day season.

A strong and competitive finish to the end of the season including a 120-win run over Kensington in round 6 and a well fought 18 run win over Northern Districts in the final round, with all round performances with the bat by Niamh Bullen and Paris Hall, and consistent pressure from the bowling cartel.

With players stepping up in the back end of the season, our squad numbers growing, and new recruits including Niamh Bullen coming across from NSW as an underage state player, there is plenty to look forward to in season 2022/23.

The Second Grade, despite continuous losses of personnel to the Firsts was extremely competitive and finished in the semi-finals in their T20 competition and fifth in the 40 over contest. Coach, **Sy Massey**, was on hand every round to guide the young band. Equally important was the presence of the experienced heads of **Caroline Ward** and **Annette Johnson** on the field to assist youthful captain **Mackenzie McCauley** when they weren't required in the 'Ones'. **'Kenz'** herself was called to the 1st Grade on a number of occasions.

To GT who has stepped into the role of practice coordinator, the Women's Cricket Committee and Board of Management for your continued support of the women's program.

JUNIOR BOYS' CRICKET REPORT

One of WTDCC's core principals is player development which spans from juniors right through to our 1st Grade team and beyond. As a club it's a tremendous achievement to win 1st Grade premierships, it's even better when 10 of the 13 players in the GF squads played their Junior cricket at West Torrens.

One of the highlights of the Junior Campaign and in our eyes, the most important and reflective measure of the success of our junior program is how the U18 (previously U17) shield team performs. The 2021-22 squad managed to make the Semi Finals and lost by an agonisingly small (1 run) margin against eventual winner Kensington. Pleasingly, one of the members of the U18 squad, James Reuther was one of the XI which won both the Men's 1st Grade One & Two-Day GF's. James was joined in the Team of the Year from U18 carnival by Nathan Marshall. James also represented the state at U19 level this year.

The other outstanding result of the season was for our Junior Program to win the coveted SACA "Spirit of Cricket" award. Thanks to the spirit and fairness in which our leaders of the junior program, including our outstanding junior captains, coaches & game day managers conduct themselves. We are very pleased that the players and teams displayed such qualities, even when results, decisions or games may not have been going our way.

Disappointingly none of our junior teams managed to make the top 4 this year, with the U16 Red team finishing 7th (albeit without playing the bottom ranked team due to a wash out) the best result. At times it was a struggle to fill our U16 White team due to college cricket and equally as troubling in the latter half of the year were the "covid protocols". A big thank you to all those, in particularly the Parsons family, for always getting enough players to fill those voids. Often it was thanks to some of our Women's team who stepped in to help or U14s players playing up an age division. Archie Robertson was one of the U14 lads who was required in the final round, in what was a great win for the U16 Whites against Prospect, picked up a 5 for, as the team finished the season on a high.

While Covid undoubtably did provide complications, it also provided several of our junior players the opportunity to dip their toes into senior cricket, in particularly the first-round post Xmas and the last round of the season, with a number taking part in both 3rd & 4th Grade fixtures. A highlight was Max Davidson's last round 50 against Adelaide in the 4ths.

At the other end of our junior program, our Ray Sutton Shield team (now an U13 competition) performed admirably under new coach Callum Agnew. A stirring win against TTG the highlight. It is always great to see players from our Country Zone join forces with our city players.

Season's Milestones

The **Men's 1st Grade Premiership** was the 17th (including 2 unofficial war time Premierships) for the Club since we won our first as Hindmarsh in 1879-80.

Life Member **Ange Treloar** became the first West Torrens player to play 100 matches in Women's 1st Grade (longer form of the game) and is now on 105 games. She has also played 86 T20 games.

Men's 1st Grade skipper **Daniel Drew** also reached the 100 game (major competition) benchmark in the Round 11 clash with Prospect. (My apology for not letting the wider audience know at the time). In addition he has also played 36 T20 games. **Daniel** also made his maiden 1st class century (only his 2nd F/c match) when he compiled 130 v. Victoria at Adelaide Oval in February.

Irish born **Caoimhe Roche** became the first West Torrens player to pass 50 games in Women's 2nd Grade (longer form of the game) when she reached 51. She has also played 35 2nd Grade T20 matches.

12 centuries were made in Men's 1st Grade this season, the most Hindmarsh/West Torrens players have scored in a season since the SACA competition began in 1873. 'Tons' were scored by **Daniel Drew (4) Kelvin Smith (3) Bailey Capel (2) Ryan Gibson (2) and Daniel Fallins (1)**. The best prior, was 10 in 1923-24 when **Charie Dolling (5) Andy Smith (2) Norm Willoughby (2) and Hughie Bridgman (1)** were the century makers.

Kelvin Smith joined the elite bunch of Hindmarsh/West Torrens batsmen who have scored more than 4,500 runs when he made 46 and Round 11 v. Prospect and now has compiled 4,724 runs @ 50.26. Only 17 players have reached this mark since 1873 and only 7 have achieved the 5000 runs mark (on which Kelvin is closing fast). **Andrew Haslett** still the leader on 6781 runs.

Congratulations to 14 year old **Maggie Clarke** from Jamestown, who became the youngest winner ever of the **Joanne Broadbent Trophy** for the best fielder in Women's 1st Grade (the Men's equivalent is the Talbot Smith Trophy). **Maggie** is only the third West Torrens player to win the Award. The others are **Angela Moritz** (2011-12 and 2013-14) and **Brooke Harris** (2018-19).

From September 2021 to March 2022 **Murphy Short** had a *biannual* to savour. In fact quite a '*medallic*' experience. In September, playing for CMS Crows in the Yorke Peninsula Football League, he won the Mail Medal for the Yorke Peninsula Football League. In Addition he was awarded the G.M.Gunning Medal as the League's Best and Fairest. He followed up with another medal when the Crows won the Premiership. A regular all-rounder with our 1st Grade team, he then secured Premiership medals in both the West End One Day Cup and the 2-Day

Premierships. A 'lazy' five medals and three Premierships in a short space of time. Over a six-month period **'Murph'** was awarded more Medals than a seasoned War veteran.

Herculean Feat – Kayaking from Tasmania to Victoria

Current West Torrens player **Annette ('Guppy') Johnson** completed a massive undertaking in April when she sea-kayaked from Tasmania to Victoria across Bass Strait. With companion **David Williamson** they set out in their double kayak from Little Musselroe Bay on Tassie's north-east tip on April 4th. Making little island hops they reached Wilson's Promontory on Victoria's south coast on April 17th and were off water the following day at Port Welshpool.

This massive and most grueling feat could not have been affected without rest days at Whitemark on Flinders Island where they stayed for 3 days waiting for the right weather window, then a day at Craggy Island and a further day at Edith Island for rudder repairs. Throughout they received land support from another colleague **Malcolm Hamilton**.

'Guppy' is an Outdoor Education lecturer at Regency TAFE and has had a long cricket career with Flinders University-West Torrens. The wicketkeeper-batter was formerly a Scorpions squad member and currently mentors the younger brigade in the 2nd Grade and occasionally fills in in the 1st Grade when key players are on State duty.

Congratulations **'Guppy'** - you are someone of whom we are all proud and hopefully the youth of the Club will strive to emulate your skills, superior fitness and mental strength.

Interesting late snippet – The three SACA 1st Grade Premierships T20, One Day and 2-Day were taken home by the **Port Adelaide** and **West Torrens Clubs**. The two clubs which were 'personae non gratae' with the SACA during the 2016-17 season, although the Eagles took home all three Premierships that season.

Further co-incidence, the **last three 1st Grade Premierships** of the West Torrens Cricket Club **2006-07, 2016-17** and **2021-22** coincide with **last three Premierships** of the West Torrens Baseball Club 1st Grade. Prior to Baseball moving from a Winter sport to a Summer sport in 1967, many West Torrens cricketers played baseball for the West Torrens Baseball Club. Names which readily come to mind are Kingsley Wellington, Jack Carr, Bruce Dooland, Daryl Wood, Rex Blundell (all Cricket Club Premiership players or Coach), Phil Brideoak, Gary Thompson, Max Puckett, Fred Medley, Dean Smith and Brian Cakebread.

The Eagles had record **six** Men in S.A. representative teams this season viz. **Jordan Buckingham, Bailey Capel, Daniel Drew, Ryan Gibson, Harry Nielsen and Kane Richardson**. The previous best was **five** in 1981-82 season when **Jeff Crowe, Rick Darling, Roger Dugan, David Hookes and Kevin Lewis** all lined up for South Australia. In addition we had **three** Scorpions this season viz. **Kelly Armstrong, Ellie Falconer and Amanda-Jade Wellington** plus an extra Striker in **Katie Mack**.

CRICKET at the COMMONWEALTH GAMES

122 years after Cricket's sole appearance at the Summer Olympics in Paris and 24 years after its only appearance at the Commonwealth Games (Malaysia in 1998) the game will re-appear at the Commonwealth Games in Birmingham, England, in July. In 1998 it was an all-male affair for the cricketers, however this year only Women will participate. And West Torrens will have a representative with **Amanda-Jade Wellington** representing Australia.

In 1998 all matches were of 50 overs per side and had List A status (Domestic One Day) but not One day International status as the West Indian islands, as is normal at Commonwealth Games, competed as separate nations. 16 nations competed, including 7 of the 9 Test playing countries – Australia, Antigua and Barbuda, Bangladesh, Barbados, Canada, India, Jamaica, Kenya, Malaysia, New Zealand, Northern Ireland, Pakistan, Scotland, South Africa, Sri Lanka, Zimbabwe. Zimbabwe was out of Test cricket at the time and England didn't enter using the feeble excuse that the dates clashed with end of season County fixtures. Normally the Irish cricket team represents the whole of the island including the Republic. However the Republic of Ireland is not a member of the British Commonwealth.

Australia finished top of its group and routed New Zealand for 58 in the semi-final with West Torrens' **Brad Young** taking 4/4 (inc. a hat trick) from 4 overs. Australia scored the required runs with the loss of just one wicket. However in the Final the Aussies could only manage 183 and South Africa after a late stumble won with 4 wickets in hand.

At the 2022 Games all matches will be T20s, played at Edgbaston in Warwickshire and will have full T20 International status but only 8 nations will participate – Australian, Barbados, England, India, New Zealand, Pakistan, South Africa and Sri Lanka. England won an automatic spot as the host country, while the next six positions were allocated on World T20 standings (provided that each of the four ICC regions were represented). Sri Lanka won the final spot when they defeated Bangladesh in Malaysia in the final of an elimination tournament amongst all other affiliate countries.

Australia will play in Group A alongside Barbados, India and Pakistan. The ICC will now push for cricket to be accepted into the 2028 Olympic Games in Los Angeles.

West Torrens and Northern Districts are the only SACA Clubs to have representation at both the 1998 and 2022 Commonwealth Games – West Torrens (**Brad Young and Amanda-Jade Wellington**) and Northern Districts (**Darren Lehmann and Darcie Brown**).

THE PRE-EMINENCE of HOOKES (Warm-up Deliveries)

Did you know that in games under the control of Cricket Australia new bowlers cannot warm up on the centre square pitch area – penalty is a ban of 30 minutes from bowling? This happened in an Australian U17 Championships match at Henley Oval a few seasons ago. **How did this come about?**

It was a practice in Sheffield Shield games, particularly by NSW under **Steve Rixon** in the 1980s, which annoyed many batsmen including West Torrens and SA captain, **David Hookes**. Sometimes **Rixon** would pull a stump out and transfer it to a disused pitch where his bowler intended to bowl.

On one occasion at Adelaide Oval **Greg Matthews** was called to the bowling crease, handed his jumper (he always wore a pullover even when 36 deg. C.) and cap to the umpire and **Rixon** came across two pitches to receive a warm-up delivery from **Matthews**. The latter proceeded with a second and a third warm-up ball. However **Hookes** walked up and smashed the latter

over the eastern boundary fence and into the Victor Richardson gates. The umpire raced across and vehemently exclaimed:

"What the do you think you are doing?"

Hookes replied:

"If he can have a warm-up ball, then I can have a warm-up hit."

The umpire retired sheepishly to his allocated position.

Next season the ACB (now CA) outlawed the practice, never to be used again. Bowlers can have a warm-up ball or two to a fielder provided it is not on the centre square.

QUICKET QUIRKS

One of the most unfortunate of all first-class cricketers was surely **Abdul Aziz** playing in a Quaid-E-Azam Trophy match in Pakistan in 1959. His scorebook entries read **1st inns.** retired hurt 0, **2nd Inns.** absent, **dead** 0.

The unfortunate Aziz was a 19 y.o. with a history of heart trouble. In the first innings he was hit in the heart region by an off spinner and forced to retire hurt. Unfortunately he had a heart attack and died before the second innings.

In a D grade match in the Jika Cricket Association (Victoria) in 1994-95, **Vince Bruno** was dismissed twice in the same hat trick. Bruno was the ninth wicket to fall and his replacement was out next ball to W.Dunmore. In the follow on, these two batsmen were directed to open the innings and Bruno, bravely taking strike, was bowled first ball by Dunmore.

In a fund- raising drive by a Gloucestershire cricket club in 1995, the first prize in the raffle was a vasectomy donated by local doctors. Many books sold rapidly while conversely some of the younger players had much difficulty in tempting prospective ticket buyers.

Australian Test allrounder **Bob McCleod** was run out in both innings of the 1896 VCA Grand Final without facing a ball. A pair of Diamond Ducks!

A cricket match at The Oval, London in 1796 saw a team of one-legged pensioners play a one-armed XI.

When the Australians played Glamorgan at Swansea on their 1975 tour of the UK. Glamorgan's opening batting pair was **Alan Jones and Alan Jones**.

West Indian **Curtly Ambrose**, in his last appearance in Australia, bowled one of the longest overs ever in a Test match. His last over on Australian soil lasted 12 minutes and included 9 no-balls and conceded 20 runs. To make matters worse his final fling with the bat was equally bizarre. He was run out being caught a few centimetres short when sliding his bat, which became lodged in a huge crack in the pitch.

Ed Gibbins, a fast bowler for Eastbourne College in the UK, was a permanent number 11 bat. Indignant that his batting was constantly ignored, he padded up, hustled the regular number 5 into the toilet, locked him in and strode to the centre at the fall of the third wicket. He made 92, an innings that won the match.

In the Test England v. India at Calcutta in 1982, **Graham Gooch** (England) made 153 and when called on to bowl in India's innings, bowled both right arm and left arm.
