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PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Season 2022-23 provided all SA Premier Cricket Clubs with the challenge of balancing player development and the perceived ultimate need to finish the season in the top 8 of the Men's 1st Grade two day competition to remain relevant as a club. Ideally a club shouldn't just be judged on where the Men's 1st Grade finish in the Two-day comp in any given season but given the current arrangements it's hard for that not to become the focus.

Thankfully the Men's 1^{sts} started the 2-day season extremely well and we quickly turned our attention to qualifying for finals. On field results were complicated by the loss of some key playing personnel to the BBL, Redbacks & Australia "A" commitments, while one of our English players, Dan Mousley was selected into the inaugural ILT20 in the UAE.

We finished the regular season in 4th place & played Kensington in the Semi, a game that was severely impacted by rain, resulting in a draw after we were in a solid position at stumps on Day 1. We do take great pride in making finals, obviously winning them is better, but we also are extremely proud of our elite players. In our Men's group, the development of Spencer Johnson, Daniel Drew, and Jordan Buckingham during the summer of 22-23 was outstanding. Watching Spencer & Bucks bowling for Australia "A" was a highlight, as was the return of Kelvin Smith to the 1st Class arena. Harry Nielsen played some excellent cricket for the Redbacks & the Strikers. While Bailey Capel unfortunately didn't add to his first Shield game, we hope that it won't be long before he is once again knocking on the door at first class level. It was also great to have Ryan Gibson represent WT in a couple of games this year in between his Strikers & Sydney grade commitments.

Losing elite players to higher honours, was an issue for our Women's teams too. At full strength we have an outstanding First XI and 2nd Grade team. Losing players to WBBL or Australia, as Maggie Clark & Paris Hall did in the U.19 T20 World Cup, we then exposed some very young players to the next level which makes for tough results.

Moving forward to season 23-24 in the 1st Division is obviously an important result for our Men's program as it gives our elite players the ability to continue to represent their club at the highest level of local cricket in SA. It will also mean that other players are attracted to that opportunity. Brenton & Hags will again be very busy through winter.

As mentioned, while most of the club's focus was on the 1st Grade Men, it was pleasing to see some of the results from both our Men's & Women's U.18 teams and the achievements from some of our junior players who were successful in making SACA elite squads & teams. That along with the 11 players who represented the Redbacks, Scorpions or Strikers during the season mean we certainly have some very talented cricketers at WT. Our U.14 Red team made the Semi Finals and there were some pleasing results from our U.14 Whites & our 3rd Grade team, captained by the returning Matt Ferraro who did a fantastic job with the players at his disposal.

On the coaching front, both Mark Harrity & Daniel "Froggy" Murdoch will continue to lead the programs while Mark Whenan (Junior Coordinator) is working through the appointments for our junior squads. Sam Ellicott will continue to expand his role and we hope that Hags will then be freed up to spend more time coaching fast bowlers across the club. Froggy is also planning to add several new names to his list of willing helpers in the women's coaching ranks as well as being active in looking at adding to the playing stocks.

Off field the work, outside of their Board roles, of Catherine Terry & Paul Sibley enabled us to significantly improve our takings across the bar by hosting some functions in addition to the traditional Players Teas & Saturday night presentations. Froggy & the Women's squad also added Player's Teas to their program which certainly has added to the enjoyment of the playing group. The Board has also noted that the ovals that our juniors currently use are not to the standard we are comfortable with and have spent some time trying to come up with some

solutions. We think we may have some good news that will come out before the start of next season and have very recently been awarded a grant that is the first step towards solving another issue.

The Board is hoping to get moving on the planning for season 23-24 as soon as possible as the landscape of the competition at the top of the Men's program will be significantly different and we want to be able to continue to grow all facets of the club from the top right through to our youngest Academy players. Our Academy grew again last year, and we already have about a dozen new players signed up for next season. Our junior trials provided the opportunity to see just where we were with our junior program, there were approximately 100 players who attended which made for some very hard decisions, thanks to those who helped work through all the names, particularly Paul Duffett & Felix Jones who helped oversee a trial game at Henley for some new hopefuls.

Finally, it was great to see so many players, partners, parents & familiar faces along with some new ones attend both the Junior (at the club) and Senior trophy night (at the Eagles Function room). Both were fantastic evenings, thank you to Mark & his Junior Committee and Peter Hutton, Andrew & Michelle Capel who did the bulk of the organising. So many fantastic contributors to our club received playing trophies, awards & thanks, it was a timely reminder of just what goes into running this great club and how lucky we are of some of the people that make it work. Unfortunately, some will move on; we all thank those who have dedicated so much to the club in one way or another and we hope to see them around in the coming years.

The increase activity at the club after matches was also a highlight of the year. We hope, as people return to normal activities after the few years of "covid hibernation", numbers at these events will only continue to improve.

As always, things don't happen at any club without volunteers. A big thankyou to those who helped this year, in the bar, Paul Sibley (Bar Manager extraordinaire), Luke Terry and Peter Hutton all put in additional hours so that we could host 18th Birthdays, Birthdays, Christmas Shows and Wakes at the club adding to the fundraising coffers. TREASURER'S REPORT

The club's financial statements for the year ended 30 April 2023 are set out on the following pages and show a net profit of \$4,694 compared to \$4,287 last year. Both income and expenses increased in comparison to 2022, and some of the reasons for this are as follows:

- Player subscriptions were up due to increased participation across all grades (Men's/Women's Seniors and Juniors) as well as the growth of the club's Academy program.
- SACA distributions began to return to pre-Covid levels, however part of this increase is due to the timing of final payment of the 2022 being received in 2023.
- Fundraising income and expenses both saw a large increase due to the club finally being able to put on some great events which had been cancelled in previous years. This is a great sign and hopefully continues to grow in years to come.
- Canteen and catering profit grew from \$4,233 in 2022 to \$13,090 in 2023. The reasons behind this are similar to those above, but also having Kathleen Brooks work her magic in the kitchen this season was a massive bonus.
- The club was able to hire out our ovals over the Christmas break for the Adelaide Premier League which was a great additional source of income.
- Grounds and maintenance expenses were up on previous years, largely due to the significant increase in playing commitments for the First Grade Men's team, where they played several Saturday/Sunday matches. We would expect this figure to drop in the upcoming season.

As at 30 April 2023 the club's net assets sat at \$185,498 compared to \$180,804 the year before, proving the club remains in a strong financial position moving forward. Creditors reduced significantly due to the full repayment of the new roller we purchased in 2022.

A massive thank you goes out once again to all the people who help out around the club, no matter how much, it all ends up making the club better. The club is well set across the grades to continue growing, and with the continued support of players and families we will thrive for years to come.

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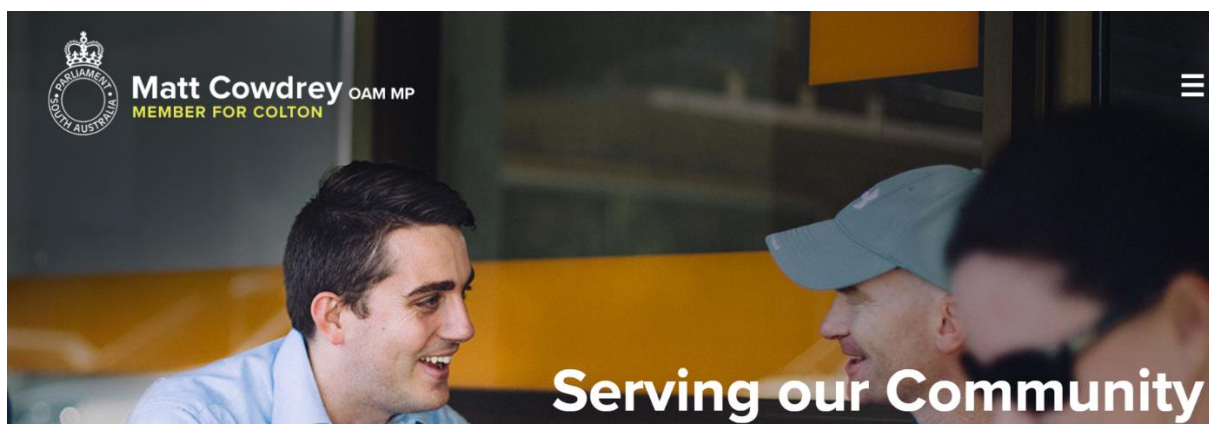

MEN'S CRICKET REPORT

Season 22/23 presented new challenges with the SACA making the decision to create a two division First Grade competition in season 23/24, so all teams were striving to be finish in the top 8 to enable them to be part of the inaugural 8 team competition.

Whilst we were not able to win the ultimate prize again in the two-day competition in First Grade, this season was still very successful for our club in the Men's program as several individual players produced outstanding performances which put them in line for higher honours on the Australian cricket stage. Daniel Drew continued his development with a double century against Western Australia and finished second in the Sheffield Shield batting aggregate after missing the first 2 games of the season. Spencer Johnson took 6/87 and 7/47 in two First class games and starred in the BBL, Harry Nielsen put in some outstanding keeping performances for South Australia, Kelvin Smith had a brilliant season and was rewarded with selection for South Australia in both two day and one day cricket where he put in solid performances and Jordan Buckingham highlighted his continuing development at First class level with selection in the Prime Minister's X1 and then his selection for Australia A with Spencer, where he took 6/50 in one innings and Spencer 4/46 in an innings against the New Zealand A team.

Once again, our First Grade made the finals and but for some weather and player availability, we may have been playing off again for the First Grade two day premiership. Many of our first-grade players had excellent seasons, we were also fortunate to have the services of Dan Mousley for part of the year and Sean Hunt who both performed extremely well and were important cogs in our team. We blooded some new players in First Grade such as Seb Young from Sturt who had performed well previously, while Luke Terry and Hudson Walshaw also debuted, and we saw continuing emergence of promising young players such as Oliver Ellicott in second grade.

Our Men's program continues to benefit from the selfless commitment from Hags and our coaches in developing a club environment where our first-class players feel at home with all our playing group and club members to enjoy their cricket.

Next season presents an exciting opportunity for our club to rise to a new challenge in an eight team first grade competition. The standard will improve and our focus as a club necessarily needs to include a heightened focus on our development players in second/third and fourth grade as both the future of our club and providing player depth and a competitive environment across the club. At different times this year these teams demonstrated significant improvement with strong individual performances from players within these teams. As a club to see our second, third and fourth grades pushing into the finals is a key factor in adding to the successful culture of our club and building depth. All these players and the young players transitioning to the seniors from the Under 16 program are important pillars of our club.

As our cricket Academy has continued to develop greater numbers, so the opportunity to further develop our competitiveness and improve standards across our club both within the junior program and our senior development program presents itself. Whilst not wanting to over emphasise individual work I would like to note the continued energy and commitment by Kent Sendy to growing this program. Our Junior/Senior and Women's program will continue to focus on improvement and culturally the Gratitude Program provides an important opportunity to focus on connections throughout the club and to the wider community. The West Torrens Young Eagles Academy continues to grow year on year, we have experienced growth of around 300% since the 20/21 season. Given this expansion we have had to call upon many coaches and methods to continue to provide an outstanding program where players can thrive both individually and, importantly to the club, as a squad and teams in our games against other Academy or Club teams.

In season 22/23, right from the first night when Spencer Johnson & Jordan Buckingham presented about 40 caps to our new players, while our returning squad worked with Brenton, Hags, Felix, and Alex Hutton, we were lucky to have some of our elite players visit the Academy. English players, Dan Mousley, Sean Hunt & Sean Ryan spent many sessions with the boys while Daniel Drew helped David Rex with some batting drills late in the year. Senior players like (First Grade wicketkeeper) Luke Terry and Luke Edmunds also dropped by to assist regular coaches Oliver Ellicott & Sam Turner on occasions. The Academy played several games against Kensington and one each against Port, Woodville, East Torrens, the Western District Junior Cricket Association U.12 rep team and Glenunga during the year plus a few internal trial games at Henley, Henley High or John Mitchell Oval. We were extremely competitive in all games and recorded some good wins against all premier clubs. Some of the highlights included our running between wickets, fielding and general team play, especially in the games against East Torrens (away) and Kensington at Henley Oval (under lights). One thing we want to add is more internal games. However, the early season wet weather made that more difficult.

We had an extraordinary **FIVE** West Torrens players represent Australia during the season

It began with **Amanda-Jade Wellington's** selection to represent Australia at the Commonwealth Games in August 2022 in Birmingham, England and the pre-games tournament in Ireland. Australia won the Gold Medal at these games. Amanda will also represent Australia A in a tournament v. England this winter in England.

Wello's selection was followed by **Maggie Clark** and **Paris Hall** representing Australia at the inaugural Women's U.19 World Cup in South Africa where they were defeated in the Semi-Final for which both Maggie and Paris were selected. Maggie was the only Australian player selected in the Team of the Tournament (a World XI).

At the end of the season both **Spencer Johnson** and **Jordan Buckingham** were selected to play for the Australia A team against New Zealand in Lincoln, on the outskirts of Christchurch, N.Z. Two F/c games were played and Spencer secured 4/53 on debut and 'Bucky' 6/58 on debut.

It is incredibly unique for a Club to have two international representatives in a season. West Torrens has had two Aussie reps in a season only twice before. The first instance was in the 1946 Australian team to New Zealand. They were **Bruce Dooland** and **Ron Hamence**. Australia played just the one Test and neither Bruce nor Ron were included. The second instance was in the Test series v. West Indies in 1979-80 when **David Hookes** and **Ian Chappell** were chosen but didn't play together in the same Test match.

The **2023 FairBreak Invitational T20** was the second edition of a special Women's International T20 tournament and was held at the Kowloon Cricket Club in Hong Kong in April. A total of 90 players from 28 countries were spread across six teams. **Amanda-Jade Wellington** played with the Warriors which defeated Falcons by 94 runs in the Final.

An additional tournament for 2023, staged in collaboration with USA cricket will be played in Houston, Texas, USA, between 15 and 30 September 2023.

Ange Treloar won this season's Joanne Broadbent Fielding trophy (Women's 1st Grade) and became the only person to have won both the Margaret Jude Trophy (wicketkeeping) and the Joanne Broadbent Trophy.

Our newest First class debutant, **Spencer Johnson**, first learned the basic skills of the game in the back yard with brothers Oliver and Isaac. He began his illustrious playing career as a ten year old from St. Michaels College in season 2006-07, when he followed older sibling

Oliver to the Eagles nest and was selected in the inaugural Young Eagles Academy. The next season he was included in the Ray Sutton Shield and Under 14 White teams and then clambered his way up through the Grades until he debuted in 1st Grade in October 2013 as a 17 year old.

The strong left-handed quick soon captured the eyes of the SACA Under 19 selectors but was out of cricket injured, for a year after the under-19s with stress fractures, particularly in the feet. He came back into Premier Cricket in 2016-17 and helped West Torrens win 1st Grade premierships in all three formats. This was the season in which the SACA Board attempted to force the Club to merge with Port Adelaide or face relegation. Spencer played a major role in this unique Club triumph.

He received a 'Redbacks Rookie' contract for season 2017-18 and made his debut in the JLT One Day Cup against Victoria at North Sydney Oval on 12 October 2017. However, injuries, especially stress fractures, continually hampered the tall fast bowler and he only appeared for the *Eagles* in 2nd and 3rd Grades during that season solely as a batsman. He was delisted by the SACA High Performance Department ahead of the 2020/21 season, but was recalled for the One Day Cup season for two matches. He was also named in the Adelaide Strikers' squad but was not called upon to play.

Harking back to his youth Spencer when barely out of secondary school he was given a TV opportunity as 'body double' for the incumbent Australian quick Mitchell Starc who was filming a television commercial on arid salt plains in outback Western Australia,. Spencer recalls

"In this ad, he was supposed to be bowling to himself, so when he was batting or when he was fielding and standing in different spots, that's where I came in. I'm obviously not in focus and you can't tell it's me, but it gave me a chance to see him close up and I got to film a bit of his action while he was bowling on those salt plains."

Spencer's genuine pace, coupled with bounce extracted by his imposing height has contributed to some worrying moments for those awaiting his 150 kph deliveries 18 metres away. His action is smooth, graceful and discerning which enables to him to have the ball deviate in either direction through the air or off the deck, which at his genuine pace poses problems for the batsmen.

Spencer really launched onto the Aussie cricket stage when he debuted for the Brisbane Heat during the 2022-23 BBL season off the back of some strong form for Redlands in the QCA T20 Max competition and enjoyed a stellar debut campaign in the the latter stages of the competition culminating in an appearance in the Final. Playing in front of a crowd of 54,000 at Optus Stadium in the BBL Final v. the Perth Scorchers has been his biggest thrill to date.

His long awaited First class debut came at Junction Oval, St. Kilda in February of this season and his 20 wickets @23 in his four matches has quite rightly earned him a lucrative Redbacks contract. Spencer wavers between playing in the 2016-17 Triple 1st Grade Premiership and his First class debut as the biggest achievements in his short career while Mark Harry and Trent Kelly have had the greatest influence on his success and rise.

He considers West Torrens to be

'an amazing club which has been a massive part of my life on and off the field. I have met my best mate in Drewy at the club and many, many more great friends. The passion Hags (Mark Harry) has, rubs off on everyone who wears the baggy blue and he has created something special in the playing group over the past 8 or so years.'

David Warner is the best player Spencer considers he has played against as he could hit Spencer's best deliveries to places good balls should not be hit. Warner is the best player he has dismissed but he was 90 and was caught slogging.

Spencer has recently been recruited to play for Italy in the T20 World Cup qualifiers in Scotland in July. This procurement has been on the radar for a number of years. His Nonno (grandfather Louie) was born in the north of Italy in a town called Bassano Del Grappa which meant Spencer was able to qualify to represent Italy.

Spencer is a fine all-round talented sportsman who gave up Aussie Rules football to follow his ambition to become a top line cricketer. He played football for Flinders Park through until U.18s and kicked 100 goals in HIS final season.

His latest achievement to win a baggy green for Australia 'A' and take 4/53 on debut v. New Zealand takes him a step closer to owning a 'baggy green' with a debut Number embroidered..

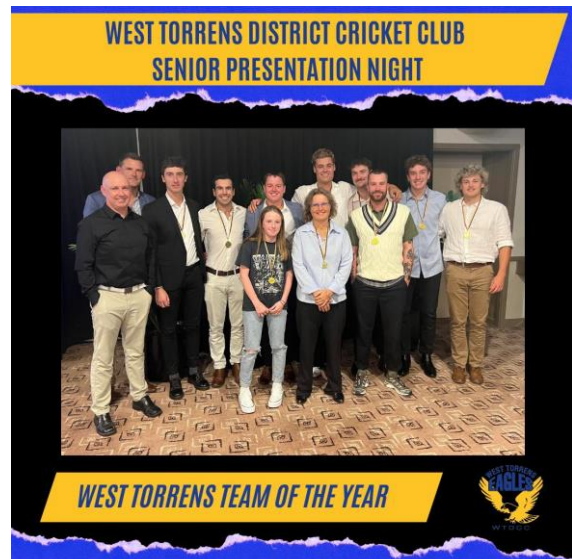

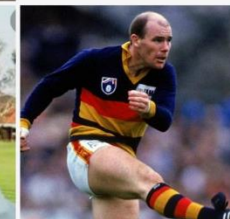
