PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The 2023-24 SA Premier Grade Cricket Season structurally looked very different than previous years with the Men's 1st Grade Two-Day Competition being split into two divisions for the first time. At this point in time, it's too early to really note any significant flow on effects to our SA Redbacks 1st Class team and their results have largely stayed the same. Next season there will be some changes to the Junior Structure & Competitions which as a club we feel may have a bigger/positive long-term impact and are a small step in the right direction.

Mark Harrity and his First Grade men once again delivered, taking out both the T20 & the One Day Premierhips, but as is reflective of this group, they feel they have some unfinished business after losing a home semi-final in the two-day competition and are keen to atone for that next season. The additions of Harry Manenti, Reggie Els & Jack Ramage further strengthen our Men's 1st Grade team and they have become very popular members of the playing group & Club. We also welcomed back (former DLCA player) Jasper Davidson & Sean Hunt (from Sussex) and they were joined by Englishmen Pat Brown, Ben Butterfield, Tom Mousley and James Robinson. All played their part in helping with our on-field success of our men's 1st Grade and most, if not all enjoyed the premiership celebrations to the full, especially the T20 premiership after one of the most dominate performances in recent history. Lead by Kelvin, Bailey & Daniel with the bat and backed up by an outstanding attack lead by Spencer Johnson, who had another fantastic year winning a BBL title with Brisbane Heat, more Aussie caps & an inaugural stint in the lucrative IPL, we simply put Glenelg to the sword to win by 130 runs! Youngsters James Reuther & Luke Terry continue to improve and have established themselves as solid 1st Grade players. A special mention to both our 2nd & 3rd Grade captains, Callum Agnew & Matt Ferraro who continue to lead well and provide opportunities for our young talent to take the next step with several U.16s given the opportunity to play both 3rd & 2nd grade during the year. It was brilliant to see Matty take out the 3rd Grade Medal for the best player in the competition at the end of season SACA Bradman/Rolton awards.

Daniel "Froggy" Murdoch and his (much) expanded coaching panel helped lead our Women to some excellent results after a couple of disappointing years. Our 1st Grade made the GF in the One Day competition, only to lose by just two runs in the big game. We welcomed approximately 20 new players, amongst them Jemma Barsby (Scorpions captain) and as a result were able to add a 3rd Grade team for the first time in our history. Daniel took out the SACA Coach of the Year award, as did Hags for the Men. Our *Sheagles*, for the 3rd time in 4 years won the "Spirit of Cricket" Award, a fine testament to how they play the game and the leaders in that program.

Off field, the task of moving the club forward often falls to our wonderful secretary Catherine Terry & our tireless Junior coordinator Mark Whenan, both of whom do an amazing amount of work. It's been great to see the transformation in recent years of our junior program, with many excellent additions to the Junior Committee, the playing group & the support network (families) around them. It was pleasing to see both U.14 teams make the Semi's (and enjoyed their new surrounds/home ground at Nazareth College) and some good results from our U.17 & U.18 (both male & female) squads. Almost 12 months ago we did receive a grant to upgrade John Mitchell oval, and while unsuccessful recently with a State Government one, we hope to have some further good news from local council that may mean we can get that underway before the start of the 24/25 season. We have also been successful in securing a grant from Cricket Australia to help contribute to the new electronic scoreboard at Henley Oval which will further add to the precinct.

Our academy grew again last year, and we already have twenty new players signed up for next season and expect around 60-70 for our sessions (which will include some of our U.13s who miss selection in any given week). Even with the change in structure for the juniors, from two U.14 & two U.16 sides to one U.13, one U.14 and one U.15.5 team on Saturday and an Under17 side playing Sunday, there were approximately 200 players, almost double from last year, who attended trials for just the 3 Saturday teams! The additional players & structural change will result

in us fielding a (young) 4th Grade team for next season which will be an extension of our junior program. Thank you to coaches James & Paul for their efforts and we welcome Damien Breen (from Grange) who will coach our new U.13 side. Damien has already overseen a few “off season” sessions for his squad with the help of Mark Harrity & Hannah Knowles. Hannah has been a super addition to our club over the past season, captaining the Women’s 1st team, helping with our Academy sessions and is a huge asset both on & off the field.

Finally, thank you to all those who contributed both on & off field in what was another successful season at West Torrens, once again it was great to see so many players, partners, parents & supporters at the Junior (at the club) and Senior (at the Eagles Function room) trophy nights. Both were great evenings, thank you to Mark & his junior committee and Peter Hutton, Andrew (regular MC) & Michelle Capel who did the bulk of the organising once again. So many fantastic contributors to our club received playing trophies, awards & thanks, it was a timely reminder of just what goes into running our club and how lucky we are of some of the people that make it work.

We are already aware of the retirement of our very popular men’s 1st grade leggie/allrounder, Dan Fallins and special note is made of his contribution over the past few years and his successful career, we wish him all the best and hope he still finds time to pop in from time to time. No doubt others will move on, and we thank them for their efforts and hope they enjoyed their time and know they are always welcome back.

TREASURER'S REPORT

The club's financial statements for the year ended 30 April 2024 are set out on the following pages and show a net profit of \$19,860 compared to \$9,026 last year, which is a great result for the club.

The club received additional funding which will go towards upgrading the turf pitch for the juniors at John Mitchell. This upgrade is long overdue and is likely to commence at the completion of next season. Player subs continue to rise, largely due to the increase in junior/academy participation over the past couple of years. This is an exciting time for the club, and it is clear the future is bright.

Sponsorship income also saw another rise. This is a crucial factor to the club's success, and this support is always greatly appreciated. Canteen and catering profits are also a strong contributor to the club and can only be possible through support from players, family and friends of the club, and especially all the volunteers who give up their time to make it all possible.

Club room hire expenses have increased which is largely due to timing differences. Some of the prior year amounts trickled into the current year, and there was also an amount owing at the end of the year which will be paid shortly.

As at 30 April 2024 the club's net assets sat at \$212,741 compared to \$192,882 the year before. As stated above the club received additional funding which hasn't been spent yet, hence the increase in the cash balance this year. The rise in creditors relates to the money owing at year end for the club room hire. Taking this all into account the club is certainly in a strong position moving forward. Continued support at club functions/presentations, as well as increased player/non-playing sponsorships will see the club enjoy another successful year from a financial perspective.

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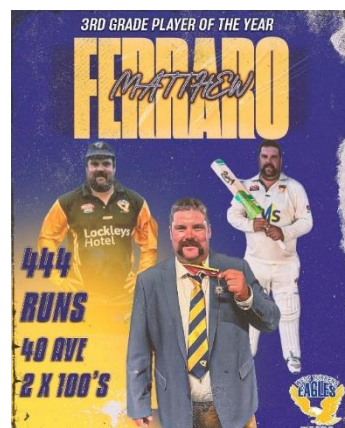
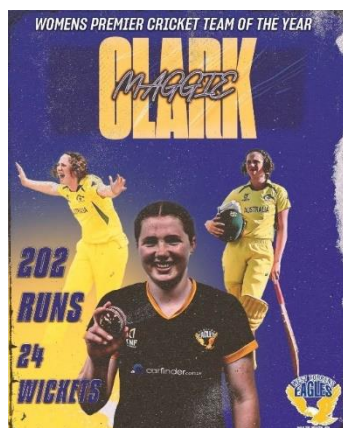

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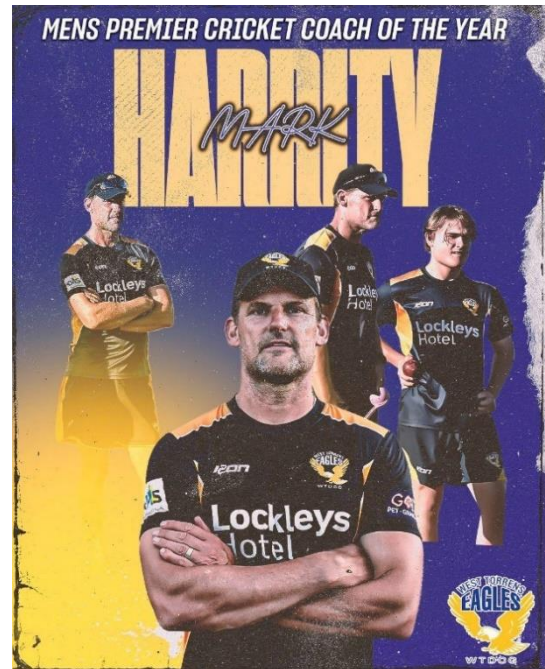
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MEN'S CRICKET REPORT

This season our club extended its record as the leading First Grade men's program in South Australian Grade Cricket. With two premierships in the One Day and 20/20 competition this season, it brought the tally of premierships of the current group with Hags as the head coach, to 7 premierships from the beginning in 2016/17 to the end of season 2023/24 (including the Competition's only triple premiership),.

This is an amazing feat from Hags, all the players and the volunteers who put in so much selfless work to help the club achieve the ultimate. This season saw the second grade begin to build experience within an inexperienced group, achieve some success and next year promises much for this group. We have many talented players in the third grade including some underage players with outstanding promise for the future.

The T20 final saw outstanding batting from Smith, Capel and Drew and an outstanding team bowling performance. The One Day final was characterized by an outstanding century from Harry Nielsen, and a brilliant partnership with the very promising Reggie Els, combined with outstanding bowling from Jordan Buckingham and Sean Hunt.



On an individual level Kelvin Smith winning the Bradman medal and Harry Manenti winning the Club player of the Year were highlights. At a state level Jordan Buckingham continued to improve and he has a very promising future, whilst the development of James Reuther as a high quality first grade bowler, was exciting to see. Spencer Johnson was outstanding in the BBL, played for Australia and was rewarded with an IPL contract, whilst Daniel Drew will be back next season as one of the most promising young batsmen in the country at first class level,. This season another highlight was Matt Ferraro who is an outstanding club person, winning the SACA Sid Daly Medal for the most valuable player in 3rd grade – having previously won the K.C.Butler Medal (2014-15) for the leading player in 2nd Grade.

I would like to thank everyone at West Torrens for the opportunity to be part of such a brilliant cricket club, and the wonderful times I have had for the last 8 seasons as Cricket Director. Several of these years were spent coaching with Hags in the academy and as an assistant coach with the senior program. Prior to this I worked as the junior coordinator for 9 seasons in a period where we had so many brilliant young juniors. Watching these juniors grow into outstanding members of the club and achieve so much has been an absolute highlight. I would like to thank Hags, Kent, Rocka and Scott, and many others for their support in my role. We have had a lot of fun and an amazing period of success, and I am confident that the future is very bright, for our great club. We have bought a property in the Adelaide Hills to breed some horses, so my time as Cricket Director has come to an end. I look forward to watching West Torrens continue to dominate grade cricket in the future and will endeavor to send any talent coming to SA, I am aware of, to West Torrens. Thank you.

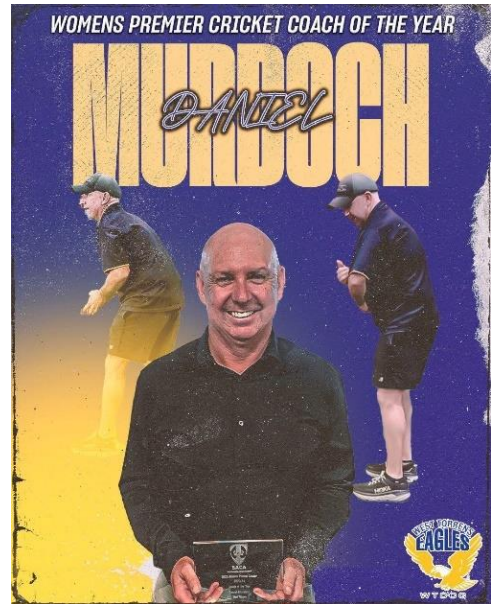
WOMEN'S CRICKET REPORT

1st Grade

The 2023/24 was a big season for the women's program. With a new captain announced, Amanda-Jade Wellington, plus around twenty new recruits to the club we felt we were in a strong position. The girls had a strong preseason which led to a great start to the season winning early games. The T20 season ended with a nail biter against Glenelg to get into the Grand Final which unfortunately didn't go our way. The One Day - 50 overs season was a strong season for us finishing 3rd and playing in a semi-final against Sturt which saw us take 6 wickets for 5 runs to make the Grand Final. In a hard-fought battle, which saw both teams having the advantage at various stages, ended with West Torrens falling just 2 runs short. Even though we lost this game, it has ignited a fire in the belly of our players, and we look to take it one step further next year.

2nd Grade

Under young captain Mackenzie McCauley we saw this playing group grow from strength to strength. With a lot of new faces including new country players to the club, Mackenzie brought the team together to reach the T20 semi-final only to be rained out on the day, resulting in the opposition moving through to the Grand Final. The One Day - 50 overs season was a season full of growth, with an early loss the team turned it around and saw many players grow and get higher opportunities. The team ended beating the top side twice only for some results not falling our way meant we missed playing finals by only 0.04 Nett Run Rate. It is great to see so many girls now pushing to play higher levels and having competition for spots.



3rd Grade (ATCA 1st Grade)

This was the first time West Torrens has entered a side in this competition, which enable us to give more players the opportunity to play under the West Torrens banner. It gave the girls the opportunity to play different roles and exposed them to senior cricket before jumping into the district competition. The development and confidence of the girls playing in this competition continued to grow each week, this was noticeable by competing for a finals spot in the last week of the season. By adding this team to our women's program, it has strengthened our program and players, enabling us to become one of the most talked about programs in Women's Cricket.

State Representatives

At West Torrens we have a strong representation at state level. With the likes of Amanda Jade Wellington, Jemma Barsby, Maddie Penna, Paris Hall and Katie Mack playing for the Scorpions or Strikers or both. We also had Maggie Clark who represented us in the National U19 and State U19 teams. Hannah Knowles, in her first season at WT & indeed Australia was a great addition to our coaching group and having Jasper Davidson out from the UK for the second year added another fantastic senior player to our coaching group. The WT YE academy continues to grow year on year, we have experience growth of around 300% since the 20/21 season.

With a host of new female players this season it was brilliant to have Scorpion's & our 1st Grade keeper Paris Hall joining superstar Spencer Johnson in presenting caps & shirts to all the new players for this year's intake. We were lucky to have some of our elite players visit the Academy - Sean Hunt (Sussex) & English T20 capped bowler Pat Brown helping our fast bowlers and Daniel Drew dropped in with plenty of gifts for the players during the season.

Later in the year club assistant coach David Rex and Life Member Jarrad Taylor also lent a hand alongside senior players such as Luke Terry (first grade WK), Archie Robertson, Oliver Ellicott & Sam Turner. Once again Stephen Cavanagh took the players for our weekly warm up routine and Damien Breen helped oversee games and will step in to coach the U.13s next season.

From these Academy players we will no doubt see many junior players and hopefully some who will play right through the grades at WT and perhaps beyond. We already have almost 30 new players ready to join next year's Academy which will replace some of the players who have been named in our U.13 squad for the newly formed SACA U.13 competition. It was also very pleasing to see one of our older players, Max, get a call up to the U.14 squad from the Academy group for next season and we wish him great success and rewards for sticking to it and improving his game with our Academy squad.

Milestone

Our win in the Men's OD Cup Grand Final on Sunday 25 February was our **50th SACA Premiership** since moving to Henley Oval from Thebarton Oval in 1997. The Men have won 20, the Women 11 and the Juniors 19. **Mark Harrity** has now been involved in a total NINE 1st Grade Premierships at West Torrens (and in each of the 3 formats of the game – 8 as Coach and 1 as a player). **Kelvin Smith** and **Daniel Drew** in SEVEN.

The Club was in its 'death throes' at our former Headquarters at Thebarton Oval. 'Thebby' had served its purpose very well since the Club moved there from Hindmarsh Oval (Cooper's

Stadium) in 1921 but now, as there were very few juniors in the catchment area, it was time to pull up stumps and seek greener fields. The foresight of President **Brian Isaac**, Secretary **Doug Wyman**, **Helen Lewis** and the remainder of the **Committee** led us to Henley Oval for the 1997-98 season. So the Club, now 168 years old and the oldest continuous sporting club in South Australia continued to prosper.

50 Premierships in 27 seasons is worthwhile noting as we had secured just 17 Premierships (Senior and Junior) in the 50 years prior to moving to Henley Oval).

In addition to the team successes, there have been many individual players who have played at a higher level in that time. We have also had 11 men and 9 women represent West Torrens who have achieved international honours plus 30 men and 22 women have played at state level.

We had to resurrect the Junior side of the Club when we arrived at seaside and eventually built it into becoming an envied producer of skilled juniors, even though we still have the smallest populated junior catchment area. Our next move was to implement a Women's playing section of the Club which was done in 2007-08 with one 1st Grade team. Today we have three women's teams with about 50 registered players.

In 2006-07 West Torrens became the first SACA Grade Club to introduce a Junior Academy. At the time it was for players under the age of 12 to eventually feed into our Junior cohort. Many Clubs have followed suit. Now that has expanded into a wider spectrum of players requiring more coaches.

The Henley era has been a busy, turbulent but wonderfully impressive period of time for the West Torrens (nee Hindmarsh) Cricket Club. It may be time to select a time of the era for both Men's and Women's or even a Combined squad!

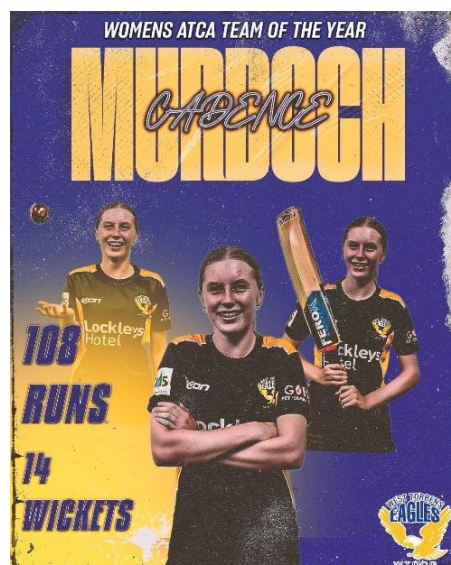

HIGHLIGHTS & ACHIEVEMENTS



AUSTRALIAN SERVICES TEAM 1945-46

The Australian Services Cricket team was formed in England in 1945 at the conclusion of World War 2, from Australian airmen and soldiers, to provide entertainment on the cricket field for the sports starved English public. It was a unique team as it was an official Australian Defence Force unit serving in Europe at the conclusion of the war with Germany, with its own Commanding Officer and all of its members including masseur and scorer were serving defence force personnel. The unit was led by Squadron Leader Stan Sismey, the team's keeper, although on the field he was no longer in charge, as that baton passed to Lindsay Hassett, the only member of the team with previous Test experience. The Australian Prime Minister John Curtin had been pushing for the immediate resumption of international cricket after the war was over. Unfortunately he died after the second 'Victory Test'.

The Secretary of the MCC, Pelham Warner, suggested that a combined Australian Services team should play a number of 'Victory' Tests against a fully representative England team which was not restricted to servicemen alone. The five 'Victory Tests' were considered first class matches but not Tests as was the game against H.G.D. Leveson-Gower's XI at the Scarborough Festival. Thus the Australian Services Team was born.

The normal duties of these servicemen became net practice and competitive cricket. They were paid to play first and second-class cricket yet they were not professionals as no money was forthcoming from the Australian Cricket Board nor the gate, but they received their normal defence force pay. One West Torrens player was selected among four South Australian players in the group. He was **Flt. Lieutenant Ross Stanford DFC OAM** (father of current Club Life Member Greg) who had represented South Australia prior to the war. Other *Eagle* players who had played first class cricket and would have almost certainly been chosen, Bruce Dooland, Ron Hamence, Bert Hearfield and Phil Ridings were not eligible as they were serving in the Pacific theatre as the war against Japan was not over.

The forerunner to this team was an RAAF side comprising airman on leave and which played many one and two day charity games while the war in Europe raged. Australian representatives, former West Torrens player Charlie Walker and Victorian and Test batsman Ross Gregory, were killed before the RAAF team was formed and another *Eagle* Ken Ridings was shot down over the Bay of Biscay shortly before he was due to captain the side at Lords. Ken Alcorn was another West Torrens player to play for the RAAF.

The side was composed of an amalgam of this RAAF team, and another group of mostly members of the regular Army from Australia, serving in Europe. The players were deliberately stationed with each other in England for the express purpose of forming a cricket team to tour the country, Many had been wounded during the conflict. Sismey had to leave the ground during at least one game, because a piece of metal had begun to work its way out of his body. During the India stage of the tour, he withdrew from the team temporarily so that surgeons could remove shrapnel.

The playing personnel comprised Lindsay Hassett capt. (Vic) Keith Miller vc. (Vic-NSW) Colin Bremner (Vic) Keith Carmody (NSW-WA) Bert Cheetham (NSW) Bob Cristofani (NSW) Reg Ellis (**SA-Sturt**) Cecil Pepper (NSW) Jack Pettiford (NSW) Charles Price (NSW) Arthur Roper (NSW) Stan Sismey (NSW – wk.) Ross Stanford (**SA-West Torrens**) Dick Whittington (**SA-Sturt**) Eddie Williams (Vic) Graham Williams (**SA-East Torrens**) and Jim Workman (**SA-Port Adelaide**). Keith Carmody and Graham Williams had both recently been released from Prisoner of War camps.

English Test players who took part were Wally Hammond capt. Len Hutton, Cyril Washbrook, Les Ames, Doug Wright, Denis Compton, Billy Griffiths, Bill Edrich, Laurie Fishlock, Eddie Phillipson, Dick Pollard, Walter Robins, Jack Dewes and Donald Carr. Phillipson, of Lancashire, later became a Test umpire.

One further first class match was played between the Dominions and England following the final 'Victory Test'. The Dominions team consisted of eight of the Australian Services team (H.S.Craig, J.Pettiford, K.Miller, C.Pepper, R.Cristofani, G.Williams, R.Ellis, C.Bremner) plus the West Indian great Learie Constantine, Martin Donnelly from New Zealand and South African D.R.Fell. The Dominions won one of the finest games ever played at Lords with eight minutes to spare. 1241 runs were scored in the three days, with Wally Hammond scoring a century in each innings, great

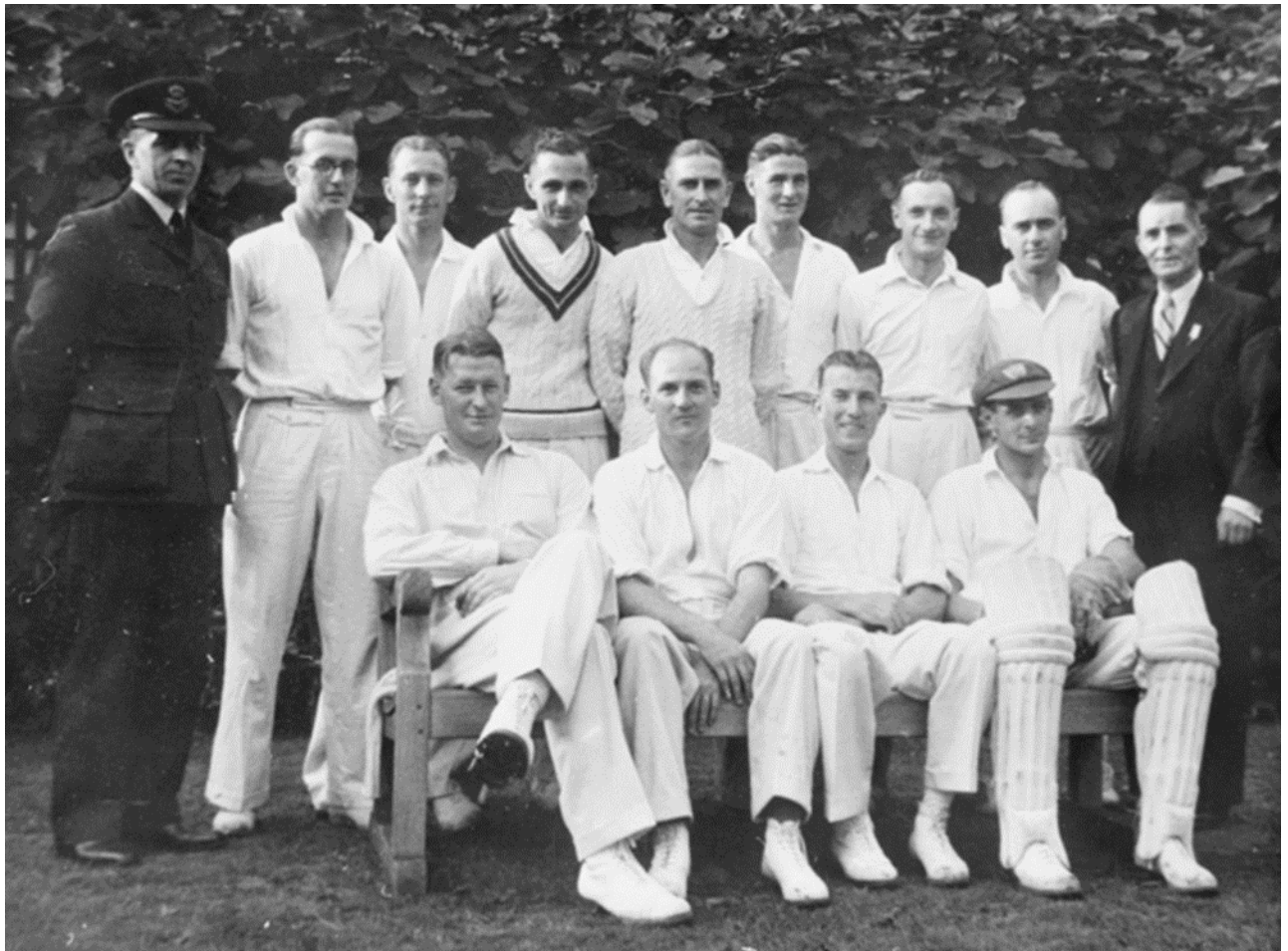
hundreds by Donnelly and Keith Miller and England's Leg spinner Doug Wright taking 5 wickets in each innings. There were many highlights, but the standout was Miller's faultless 185 with seven sixes and thirteen fours in 165 minutes. With Constantine he added 117 runs in forty five minutes.

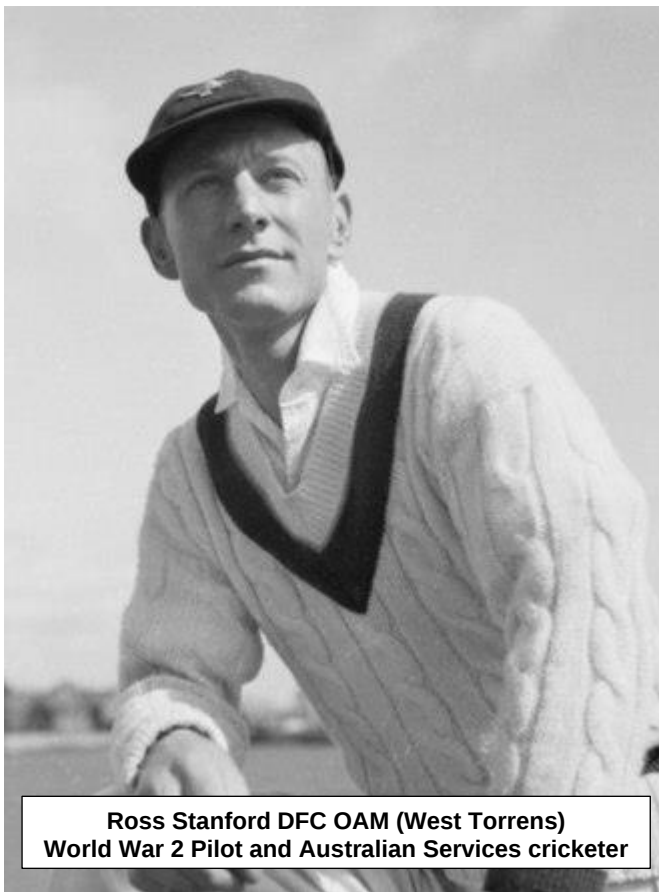

During the 1945 season the drawing power of the Services team increased. Invitations came from the South African High Commissioner and the Indian Government in London for short tours by the Services team while on their way home to Australia. The availability of shipping was the key factor in deciding that the tour should be to India. The team sailed from Liverpool for Bombay aboard the RMS *Samaria* on 3 October 1945. The playing personnel was the same as in England except for Bert Cheetham and Graham Williams who went home to Australia.

Once the tour was agreed to, the Indian Cricket Board began to draw up a program which was not announced to the Australians until they arrived in Bombay. There they discovered that the itinerary required them to travel very long distances by train, the first being a 42.5-hour trip from Bombay to Lahore (now Pakistan).
