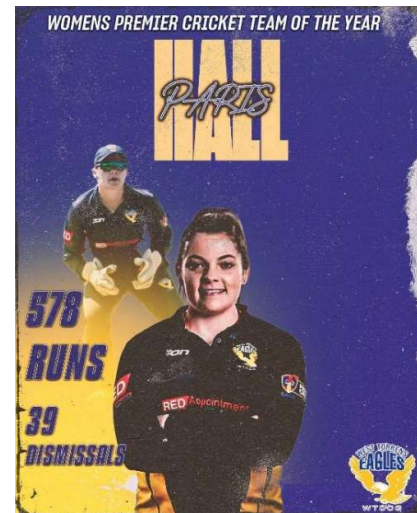
## PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Coach **Mark Harrity** and his Men's 1<sup>st</sup> Grade team are once again to be congratulated on another premiership, this time it's the One-day title that they have added to our burgeoning trophy cabinet. That's 7 across the three different formats over the past eight seasons.

Unfortunately, in the two-day comp, we bowed out in the home Semi Final to Port after losing the toss on a bowler friendly deck, which was a disappointing end to another successful season. Another outstanding night was had at the recent Bradman/Rolton Medal, with WT players, coaches & teams amongst the winners on a very consistent basis.

Our Women's program, as well as making it to the One Day Grand Final, were awarded the "Spirit of Cricket" Award, for the 3<sup>rd</sup> out of the last 4 years. **Matty Ferraro**, our third-grade captain and previous winner of the KC Butler Medal (for best 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade player), won the Sid Daly Medal (best 3<sup>rd</sup> Grade player). We had both our senior coaches, **Mark Harrity & Daniel Murdoch** win "Coach of the Year" for the Men's & Women's programs, while **Paris Hall, Maggie Clark, & Kelvin Smith** won Team of the Year honours. **Mackenzie McCauley** was runner up in the Lyn Fullston Medal (Women's 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade best player) and **Paris Hall** was runner up in the Margaret Jude Trophy (Women's 1<sup>st</sup> Grade Wicket keeper of the Year). It was also noted that WT had won the Men's White Ball Premiership double and to cap off a very successful night, **Kelvin Smith**, with 5 votes in the last game of the season, tied to win his 2<sup>nd</sup> Bradman Medal as the best player in Men's First Grade cricket.

Our Women have started to get the rewards from all their hard work over the past two seasons, with a fantastic Semi Final win in the One Day competition, followed by an agonisingly close loss in the GF. I'm sure the last two weeks of the season will provide further ammunition for this group to continue to push for greater rewards. Over those two weeks we have seen a further solidification of the men's & women's programs, with great support & enjoyment being shared. It does help having two of the very best Premier Grade head coaches at the one club, although let's hope they stick to cricket and not venture into the world of athletics which has seen them marginally worse for wear on A couple of Monday mornings!



On field it's easy to pick out lots of positives from our Academy, our juniors, and onto our senior men & women, a season that had many highs but as a club we certainly have had some very trying and sad times which did take a huge toll on the playing group. The support, love and caring that this club possesses in such adversity is part of why it's a very special place.

As we now start to move into the offseason and planning for the 2024/25 cricket season, it's also pleasing to note that we've recently held some initial trials for our 3 junior teams for next season with almost 200 players registering for the sessions. Thank you to the very organized, **Mark Whenan** and our senior, junior & academy coaches, senior players (including **Kelvin Smith, Levi Barratt, Hannah Knowles & Jordan Buckingham**) and volunteers for helping to manage such massive numbers! To say the future looks very promising would be a considerably understatement.

We look forward to the club trophy Presentation Dinner and to watching what some of our Elite players get up to in the IPL, English Summer Season & the English 100, over our winter. **Spencer Johnson** has made a start by taking some crucial wickets in his Titan's first up win against the Mumbai Indians in his IPL debut.

## STAN THE STATISTICIAN

### Stan the Statistician (from Semmie South) stipulates

In Round 11 **Jemma Barsby** (118) and **Madeline Penna** (121) created a new record for the 2<sup>nd</sup> wicket partnership in Women's 1<sup>st</sup> Grade when they amassed 219 v. Adelaide at Glandore Oval. The previous best was 175 by **Angela Symonds** (82) and **Lauren Ebsary** (202 n.o.) v. Port Adelaide at Henley Oval in October 2010. This is also the first time that there has been a double-century partnership for our Women, bearing in mind that they play all limited-over matches. It is also the first time that there have been two centurions in the same match for West Torrens.

Also in Round 11 **Charlie Henderson-Whitehead** (22 n.o.) and **Makenzie Holy** (35) created a new 8<sup>th</sup> wicket partnership record of 65 for the 8<sup>th</sup> wicket in Women's 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade v. Adelaide at Henley Oval. The previous best was 47 by **Maggie Clark** (29) and **Jemma Torsney** (22) v. Southern Districts at Henley High School in January 2020.

**Amanda-Jade Wellington** followed up with a maiden Sheagles century in Round 15 when she smashed 106 from 98 balls v. Sturt at Price Memorial Oval. On the journey to the 'ton' she smashed 6 x 6s, 7 x 4s and one car sun roof.

Centuries to **Jemma, Maddie and Wello** is the first time that the Sheagles have had had three different century makers in the same season. The women have now scored 24 1<sup>st</sup> Grade centuries distributed amongst 11 players since our first Women's team in 2007-08.

### ***Congratulations Jemma, Maddie, Wello, Charlie and Kenz.***

**Harry Nielsen** (116 n.o.) and **Reggie Els** (53 n.o.) created a new 5<sup>th</sup> wicket partnership record for the 50 overs competition, when they rescued the 1<sup>st</sup> Grade in the One Day Grand Final v. Glenelg at Karen Rolton Oval on 25th February. Their unfinished stand of 132 surpassed the previous best of 104 by **Ryan Gibson** (75) and **Warren Peters** (35) also in a Grand Final v. Glenelg at Karen Rolton Oval in February 2022.

Our win in the OD Cup Grand Final on Sunday 25 February was our **50<sup>th</sup> SACA Premiership** since moving to Henley Oval from Thebarton Oval in 1997. The Men have won 20, the Women 11 and the Juniors 19.

**Mark Harrity** has now been involved in a total NINE 1<sup>st</sup> Grade Premierships at West Torrens (and in each of the 3 formats of the game – 8 as Coach and 1 as a player). **Kelvin Smith** and **Daniel Drew** in SEVEN.

### ***Congratulations to Hags and the great cohort.***

In the semi-final v. Sturt the Women's 1<sup>st</sup> Grade team put up one of the greatest come-backs which Stan has seen in his 50 plus seasons at West Torrens.

WT produced probably their worst fade-out with the bat for the season but didn't let it deter them. A ninth wicket partnership of 44 from **Nat Mitchell** and **Ram Kaur** got them to a meagre 108. With only 108 on board and Sturt at 2/54, they not only out skilled the opposition but outsmarted them also with their mental toughness. An incredible bowling effort, particularly from **Amanda-Jane Wellington** 4/8 (9 overs) with her very accurate and well flighted 'leggies' and **Maddie Penna** 4/27 (8.5. overs) with her quick flatter 'leggies' and 'toppies' completely demoralised the Sturt batters. They took the last **five wickets for one run** – Sturt all out 82. 'Wello' got a bit untidy near the end and allowed the last pair to put on a single. The fielding was particularly desperate and clean and added to the enormous pressure under which the bowlers had placed Sturt.

Unfortunately, the girls fell two runs short in the Grand Final against Kensington, in a match which fluctuated throughout the day and the balance fell the way of the 'Browns with just three balls to

spare. Both teams put on a spectacle very worthy of a Grand Final. **Maddie Penna** deservedly won the Jill Kennare Medal as Player of the Match with her gritty 64 while Jemma Barsby bowled magnificently to take 4/26.

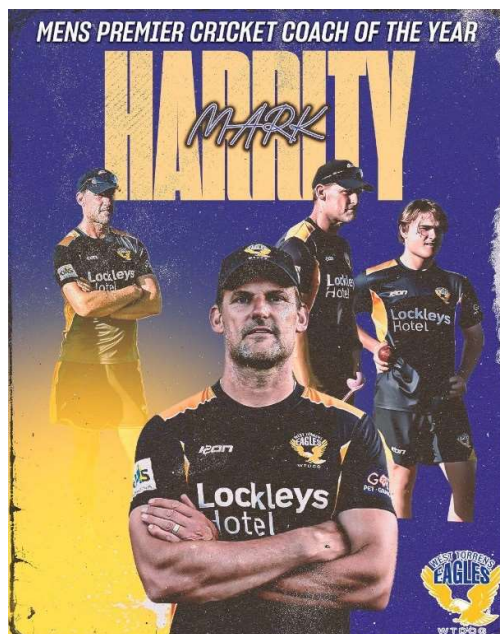

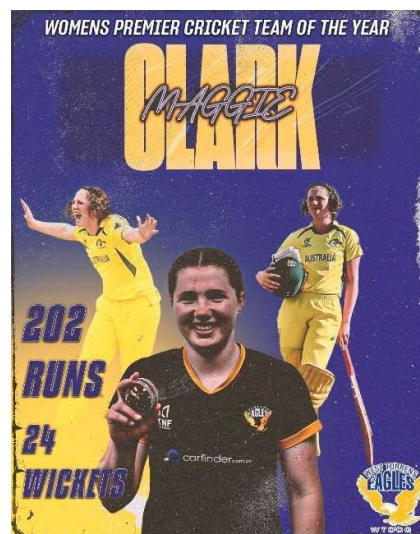

We lost to Sturt in the final round of the regular season but returned to face them the following week in the semi-finals.

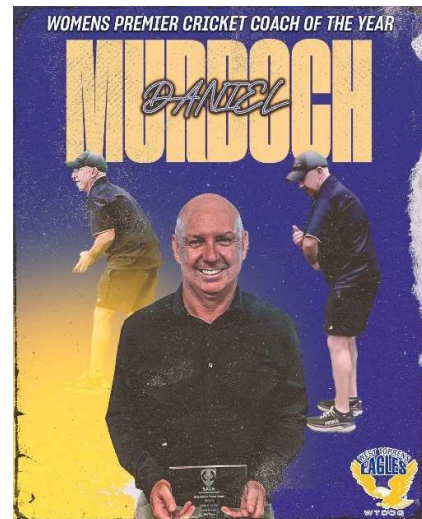

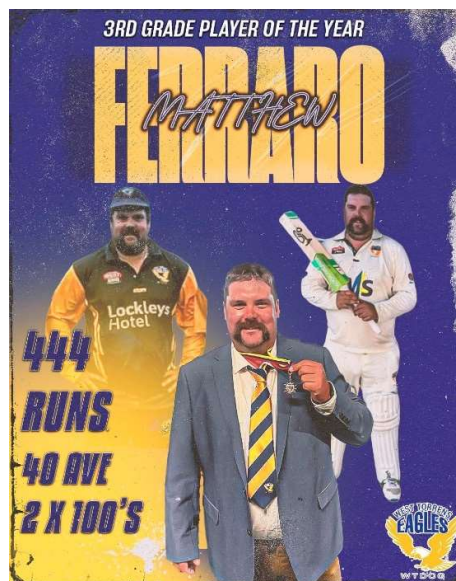

**Round 16** We received a forfeit from University for the second time this season. Now a win was needed for the team to reach the finals in its first season.

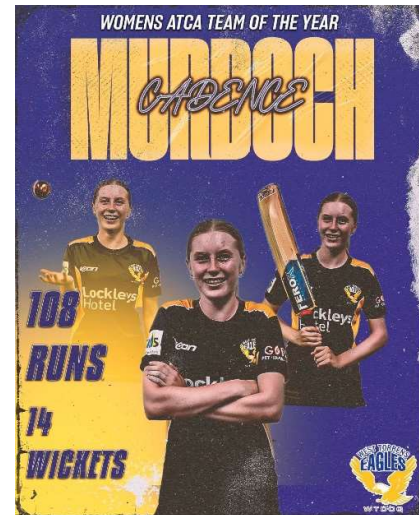

One of the legendary and most distinguished figures who has done a huge amount of toil to ensure that West Torrens District Cricket Club is amongst the leaders and strongest of the SACA Premier Grade Clubs, is **Brian Isaac**. He also rates as one the most modest about his achievements.

Brian began with West Torrens in the January SACA Under 16 competition (now U18s) in January 1958 when he won the Trophy for the most outstanding wicketkeeper. Over his 40 + years of service to West Torrens, 'Zac' served in many roles as a player and administrator and is now our No. 1 Ticketholder.

'Zac' took an early interest in cricket through backyard matches with his Dad, where weekly 'Test matches' occurred and his sister Noaline occasionally brought into service at a substitute fielder. From a humble beginning at Marist Brothers Technical High School in George St. Thebarton he progressed to the 1<sup>st</sup> XI at Sacred Heart where he was a key member of both the 1<sup>st</sup> XI and the 1<sup>st</sup> XVIII. From that 1<sup>st</sup> XI seven players went on to represent a number of different Clubs in A Grade – including three with the Eagles. One of the team also represented Australia in Tests. His tertiary studies took him to the University of South Australia where he was successful in Accounting.

'Zac' has followed along similar lines to his father, as both debuted in A Grade cricket for West Torrens as 17 year-olds and both have accreditation on the Club's Honour Board – Brian as a batsman and Bill as a bowler. Both also played SANFL football. However their paths weren't parallel as Bill played most of his career at the Adelaide C.C. where he became a Life Member and was inducted into their Hall of Fame. Bill was also a talented League footballer, topping the SANFL goalkicking twice (1943 and 1944). Brian was also a very competent SANFL footballer playing as a key forward with West Torrens from 1961 to 1966 (33 games) having began with the Senior Colts in 1959.

Brian began his senior career as a 16 year-old wicketkeeper in C Grade. His first game was against v. Prospect at Hindmarsh Oval, January 1958 (now Coopers Stadium). His stand-in skipper Ross Stanford (former S.A. and Australian Services player) knew little about him other than he was a keeper, as Ross had been lured away from Bowls and Golf for a few games. He slotted Brian in at #11 in the batting line-up. Ross was still at the crease when he came in to bat at 9/141 and he was told to play straight and keep his wicket intact. At stumps West Torrens was 9/325 with Stanford on 182 n.o. and Isaac on 53 n.o. a record for the C Grade 10<sup>th</sup> wicket record which still stands.

In November 1959 he debuted in B Grade and scored 97 as an opener but played second fiddle to centurions Bob Hank and Keith DeBoar. The writing was on the wall for an indelible batting career. So in January of that season he was promoted to A Grade. Later in that debut season 17 year old *Eagle 'Zac'* played against his 43 year old father **Bill** (Adelaide) in the last minor round match of the season at Adelaide Oval. Bill who had begun his A grade career with West Torrens had been recalled to assist the young Adelaide team after some stints coaching in the Adelaide Turf Association. This is the only one instance in 150 years of S.A.C.A. grade cricket where a son has played against his father in A grade.

Brian has played the most games in 1<sup>st</sup> Grade for West Torrens (211) a total unlikely to be surpassed as most current day players don't continue much past 30 years of age due to the constraints of the present-day playing hours, suitable only to those with First class aspirations – about 15% of participants. He is fifth on the all-time aggregate list with only Andrew Haslett, David Cassidy, Ron Hamence (one of Bradman's Invincibles) and present-day Kelvin Smith.

His game was strongly influenced by his Dad Bill and legendary Eagles captain Jack Carr, the last player to play in both a West Torrens Football and Cricket Premiership. Zac forged a reputation on the field equal to that of his famous father but left a much greater legacy in administration.

Of the many thrills which he experienced in Grade cricket one of the greatest and most satisfying was being President and instrumental in the transference of the Club headquarters from Thebarton Oval where it had flourished for most of 75 years but was sinking into its death throes, to our current nerve centre at Henley Oval. He had considerable assistance from Doug Wyman (Secretary) Pat Hookes (Treasurer) plus other Management Committee members Helen Lewis, Kevin Lewis, Don Beitz, Keith DeBoar and John Davison plus other volunteers. The move has rejuvenated West Torrens into one of the strongest Clubs in the SACA and historically into probably its strongest position financially and competitively in our 167-year existence.

Other great experiences have been as a member of the 1961-62 A Grade Premiership team and as captain of the One Day Cup Premiers (Gillette Cup) in 1971-72. Another was taking one of his few wickets in A Grade, that of Barrie Robran, triple Magarey Medallist, Australian Football Hall of Famer and S.A. First class cricketer.

Zac rates Garfield Sobers as the best player against whom he had played. An unpalatable memory was playing in a Grand Final v. Prospect when the great left-hander compiled 186.n.o. and took 5 wickets. Zac's administrative career was equally as glowing as his on-field highlights, serving as President, Treasurer, SACA Delegate, Committeeman and Council negotiator. He was unafraid to take on any adversary in the cause of a 'fair-go', no matter their stature in the Community

On one occasion he led the Club in taking on the Australian Cricket Board and the SACA during the great rift between the ACB and World Series Cricket. It was an attempt to allow WSC players to train with and play for their Clubs from which they were currently banned and Clubs would face serious penalties should they contravene the hastily instituted By-laws. Zac along with Club President Daryl Wood met with WSC representatives Richie Benaud and Austin Robertson at Football Park (West Lakes) during a WSC match Australia v. West Indies. The outcome of the meeting was an agreement with WSC that West Torrens would allow David Hookes to train and play in A Grade against the direction of the SACA and any penalties incurred by the Club would result in legal proceedings and such matters would be handled by WSC. The 'attempted coup' came to an abrupt halt when Andy Roberts smashed David's jaw in a SuperTest at the Sydney Showground and he was not able to finish the season.

His thoughts about West Torrens?

*West Torrens has always been a strong Club on and off the field which is very evident today. Great recognition of the past was also evident by the wonderful attendance of more than 500 people at the Football Park Dinner to celebrate 100 years of the change of name from Hindmarsh to West Torrens in 1997 with former players Ian Chappell and David Hookes as guest speakers.*

*Over nearly 70 years of some connection to the Club I have met great people. I clearly recall the great days at Thebarton when at end of season it was off with the footy boots and into cricket. The seasons in both sports just rolled along and from one to another – no pre-season for either. I was lucky to play cricket with WT footy legends Bob Hank, Jack Carr, Lindsay Head and Fred Bills and footy with the latter two.*

She was recruited from Clare when I emailed the family inviting her to try out with West Torrens after hearing of her natural cricket skills and being selected the SA Under 12 team. She commenced with West Torrens in the B Grade T20 competition as a 12 year-old and although naturally not achieving great heights initially in a senior Grade, impressed with her innate skills.

She had been inspired by a Milo cricket session at primary school when in the Reception class (as a 5 year old). So enthused was she that her Dad Colin took her and younger brother Liam the Watervale C.C. Milo cricket sessions which she loved, and consequently hasn't looked back! Educated at St. Joseph's P.S. Clare and Cornerstone College, Mt. Barker and having graduated as College Captain from Cornerstone College in 2020 Emily, a self-confessed nerd, moved on to the University of Adelaide where is currently studying a double degree in Engineering (Electrical and Electronic) (with Honours) and Mathematical and Computer Science. She is currently in her fourth year and looking forward to her Honours research year in 2025! She thrives in an independent learning environment.

To quote Em

- *I love learning (I am truly a big nerd) and am majoring in Renewable Energy*
- *I am excited to get a Graduate role in the energy and power sector, or space sector!*
- *A post-graduate degree (maybe a future PhD?) is not ruled out either!*

### **(Fancy a quick bowler being an obsessive intellectual! – Rocka)**

In 2021 Emily was awarded the coveted Bradman Scholarship by the Bradman Foundation which is granted to one male and one female each year to aid University undergraduates balance their cricket and academic pursuits. The recipients are required to be exceptionally talented cricketers who have also demonstrated an ability to maintain strong academic records at school and the early part of their university studies. This duality helped them to stand out amongst a strong nationwide pool of applicants. The Bradman Scholarship added to an already distinguished list of academic and cricketing achievements for the 'Hinze'.

'Hinze' relishes the fact that her future work can have a tangible impact –

*"we are always encouraged to think about the human context," she said. "Considering how what we do affects people is what really excites me."*

She began her competitive cricket career at the Clare Combined Cricket Club where she stayed until 2015 then she transferred to the Nairne C.C. when the family moved to Mt. Barker. She played U.16 Boys cricket there until 2018 but has since only competed in the Senior Women's teams with the *Sheagles*.

Skilled intellectually definitely, but also certainly skilled with the bat and ball. Emily has been in the SACA State pathways since she was 9 years old, initially with the U12 State team 2014/15, 2015/16, followed by the U16 State team 2016/17, 2017/18 and the U19 State team 2019/20. In 2018-19 she was selected in the Cricket Australia XI Under16 team which competed in U19 tournament. Her promising career has been littered with injury hurdles including a torn meniscus (at age 13), four right-knee patella dislocations and three shoulder dislocations. To top it off, she badly broke her nose at training late this season and was only fit enough to return for the Grand Final. Maybe 'Froggy' should teach the outfielders to catch with the hands rather than head-butt the field fliers. She is now getting a bit older, wiser and stronger, so is looking forward to spending more time playing matches than watching!



Her greatest achievement(s) in Cricket have been as a member of the winning teams for a double premierships at West Torrens, twice!

- Second Grade 2015/16
- First Grade 2017/18
- Unfortunately, she was on the bench for the 2017/18 T20 Grand Final, being out injured (an unfortunate habit through her cricket career)
- She was also a member of the 50 over Premiership team when no final round was played due to Covid but awarded to the minor Premier 2019-20.

Alo being chosen to play in the Cricket Australia XI team for the 2019 U19 National Tournament ranks highly.

Local Clare player and later West Torrens (Life Member), Scorpions and Melbourne Renegades quick Ellie Falconer, has been the greatest influence on Emily's game. Ellie was Em's role model for girls playing cricket, and has thought 'she was awesome at it!'

*I followed her to the SA cricket pathway and to West Torrens, and as a young player I always wanted to try to be as fast as she was!*

Emily has also represented the state at Indoor Cricket in 2017, 2018, 2019. Also, a talented swimmer she has made a few SA Country Championships and SA State Long Course and Short Course times. As a sideline she works a life guard at the local pool and over the last three seasons has coached Juniors at Hahndorf Cricket Club.

The best player against whom she has played and Why?

*Phoebe Litchfield, was always a superstar at champs, a level above the rest!*

*Having played at West Torrens since 2014/15, I have been a part of many different teams with different people, and watched the club grow and change, and adapt to new challenges.
