Stan somehow systematically scrutinized some surprising stats

Chloe Rosenzweig (60) and **Mckenzie Holy (14 no)** recently created a new record for the 10th wicket in 50-over games when they put on 38 against Glenelg surpassing the 36 (unf) stand of Caroline Ward (43 no) and Charley Phillips (18 no) v. Kensington at Henley Oval, January 2022. This was Chloe's first match for West Torrens.

During the WBBL Spring Challenge round at Karen Rolton Oval, the *Sheagles* players created a new state record when **SIX** West Torrens players took the field for the Strikers against the Perth Scorchers on 11 October (Round 1). No Club has ever previously had six women in a S.A. senior State team in the same match. The players were **Jemma Barsby (capt.)** Yr.12 student **Maggie Clarke, Paris Hall, Katie Mack, Maddie Penna** and **Amanda-Jade Wellington**. This was repeated in Round 3.

In the first One Day Cup round **Daniel Drew (143 no)** and **Harry Nielsen (86 no)** created a new 4th wicket partnership record for West Torrens in the 1st Grade One Day comp when they put on an unfinished 170 v. Sturt at Park 25 (#2) overtaking the previous best of **114 by Daniel Drew (72)** and **Daniel Fallins (48 no)** also v. Sturt but at Price Memorial Oval, in January 2022. The team score in this match (3/336) was the third highest ever by a West Torrens team in a 50 over OD game. The best being **4/408** v. Adelaide at Henley Oval, November 2021.

Amanda-Jade Wellington won the Player of the Match Award in the WBBL match Adelaide Strikers v. Sydney Sixers. **Wello** made a hurricane 40 from 16 balls which included 2x6s and 6x4s. She followed up with 2/36 from her 4 overs.

Eli Lawson (98) and **Kyle Jones (29)** set a new 4th wicket. Partnership record of 119 v. Tea Tree Gully at Pedare Christian College, Golden Grove in Round Two of the **Ray Sutton Shield (U13)**. It surpassed the previous best of 118 by **Harry Sibley (33)** and **Liam Mackie (50 no)** v. Sturt at Henley High School in October 2011.

In the Under 15 Girls competition (all matches T20s) in R2 our girls were chasing Sturt's 0/106 and openers **Sanvi Shah** (38 ret.) and **Cadence Murdoch** (31 no.) chased down the total in 9.3 overs. Against Kensington chasing 8/91 the pair again chased down the runs in 7.2 overs – **Sanvi** (63 ret.) and **Cadence** (21 no) Sanvi has now made 183 runs in this competition for once out.

West Torrens had two Players in an Australian team in same match when **Jake Fraser-McGurk** and **Spencer Johnson** represented Australia against Pakistan in a T20 match (reduced to 7 overs per side) at 'The Gabba' on November 14. Jake scored 9 and Spencer took 1/29 (2 overs).

In the next T20I match **Spencer** produced the greatest ever figures by an Australian quick in Twenty20 internationals, a five-wicket haul bowling Australia to a 13-run win over Pakistan. Australia was defending 9-147 at the SCG on 16 November, when he bagged 5-26 to have Pakistan all out for 134 and help the host nation to victory. **Spencer** became only the sixth bowler in history to take five wickets in a match for Australia in T20Is, surpassing Tasmanian **James Faulkner's** 5-27 from 2016 as the best by a fast bowler. **Spencer** was Player of the Match.

Ari Parisi (63) and **Angus Petherick (65)** created a new 5th wicket partnership record of 121 for Under the 15.5 Grade (previously U16) when they put on 121 v. East Torrens at Charles Campbell College. The previous best had been:

- 102 (Red) by Dan Voyzey and Jake Pavlich v. Glenelg at Grange P.S. March 2002
- 100 (White) by Matthew McDonnell (56 no) and Josh Foulis (44) v. East Torrens at SAYTC Magill, October 2003

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Another calendar year has (almost) flown past, and summer is well upon us. West Torrens Cricket Club has been a busy place over the “off” season and into the first part of the season. With some changes to the structures of the junior competition from 4 down to 3 junior teams playing on Saturday (plus an U17 playing on Sundays) and the age cut off being U15.5 we have found it necessary to reinstate a 4th Grade team. Trying to manage the expectations of a very large junior playing group with only 3 teams has been challenging, this has been offset marginally by Paul Duffett (U14/15 and Academy coach) leading a LO team in the ATCA competition which has been the home for some of our juniors when not playing in our junior teams.

Notably the Men's 1st team began well with two good victories in the longer form games (sitting 3rd after 4 games) & are through to the Quarter Finals in the One Day format. The additions of Jake Fraser-McGurk (Australian White Ball specialist), 1st grade opening bowler Seamus Keogh (Mildura via PACC) and Jack Carson (from Sussex) are exciting for the men's playing group and along with the returning Ben Butterfield (UK) and the now customary mid-December arrival of Sussex quick and club favourite Sean Hunt should ensure we are right there at the pointy end of the season. As is typical with the number of elite players who are often called up for higher honours our 1st team can have some different looks, but it's great to see a junior player, Alex Cappelluti take his opportunity and contribute to the First-grade team when called upon. Archie Roberston, who has been named in the SA U17 team is another junior who has started the season exceptionally well & has already been named as 12th Man in one of our 1st Grade Men's T20 games.



On field our girls haven't had the success at the top end that looked likely following on from last year but the hardworking team that Head Coach “Froggy” Murdoch and our Women's Cricket Coordinator (Nicole Parsons) & Committee have put in place will, I'm sure, quickly rectify that. One shining light has been Chloe Rosenzweig, who has quickly established herself in First grade and is already one of the premier batters in the competition.

Our junior program seems to be one of the areas of the club that is seeing a good deal of improvement, with each of the Saturday teams being ultra-competitive and sitting comfortably in the top 6 in their respective competitions and the expectation is that they should all be right in the hunt for finals come March. Sadly, we lost a club great recently, Rex Blundell, a magnificent supporter & tireless servant of the club, who was very often seen at past players & NPM functions in recent times. Rex had a long, long association with the club and will be very sadly missed by all. Personally, I have fond memories from when he helped me, a young 'keeper during my initial season at WT (U14s) back in the late 1980's and it was always a pleasure to reacquaint with him at club events. I'm sure Rocka will provide a fitting tribute to him.

The early part of the season has seen the renovation of the pitch block at John Mitchell (our 3rd Oval) begin, and while that has caused some tense moments when trying to relocate games in the first half of the season, thanks to St Michaels College (and particularly Mark Whenan, our junior coordinator & Matthew Lokan – U14 game day coach & Sports Talent Development Program Coordinator at SMC) and Trent Kelly (SACA/Park 25 curator) we have managed to work through on all home games thus far!

It has been a challenging first-half of the year for the First Grade Women, but the team has demonstrated determination, courage and unity throughout. A variable team each week due to SACA contracted players absences and also injury, required the team to be adaptable and embrace different roles.

Playing six 50-over matches through October and November, the team demonstrated our strength with the ball, bowling out Kensington, Sturt, and Adelaide. Highlight performances with the ball from Ramanpreet Kaur 3/29 (8 ov.) v. Kensington (R2), Aijay Willoughby 4/18 (4.5 ov.) v. Sturt (R5), Maggie Clark 3/60 (10 ov.) v. Sturt (R5), 3/46 (9 ov.) v. One of our very promising young 1st Grade players is opening bowler **James Reuter**. The only male offspring of 'Darkie' and Linda he was recruited from Honiton Tigers on lower Yorke Peninsula to play with the *Eagles* in the Ray Sutton Shield competition. He also has a twin Lara and an older sister Alysse. He was educated at Edithburgh P.S. Maitland Lutheran School and graduated at Immanuel College where he was also a useful footballer playing in the school's 1st XVIII. Jimmy's cricket talent was obvious from an early age and through his Junior days was selected for South Australia at U12, U15, U17 and U19 level.

His Dad had put a cricket bat in his hand from as early as he can remember, because 'Darkie' was also a Honiton player. All of Jim's school mates were also playing at an early age.

He has gradually worked his way through the Junior ranks to the seniors where he has been carefully guided by West Torrens senior Coach and former S.A. and Worcestershire opening bowler Mark Harrity.

His greatest achievements thus far, have been selection in SACA underage National champs and playing for the South Australian Second XI this season but his biggest thrills have been playing in four winning 1st Grade Premierships with West Torrens. He again burst on the scene in the first match against Port Adelaide with match figures of 8/91 and is currently enjoying his most successful season as a senior.

Early on Jimmy's mentor was local Edithburgh and later West Torrens player Joel Tilbrook, but on moving into senior ranks at the Eagles coach Mark Harrity and S.A and W.T. player Jordan Buckingham have been instrumental in giving him great help. His Mum and Dad have also helped Jim greatly through his life. Currently Jimmy is currently serving an electrical apprentice with an eye to the future, post cricket.

Whilst he was fortunate to land at West Torrens and have 'Hags' and 'Bucky' assist him, the Club is also lucky to have secured such a young talent as Yorke Peninsula is West Torrens country zone and he was sought by the Club from Primary school days. But Jimmy would have it no other way – just West Torrens!

When queried about the best player against whom he has bowled. He maintained that there were a few, such as Travis Head, Alex Carey, Nathan McSweeney and Jake Fraser-McGurk who all play at the highest level.

He regards Daniel Drew is the funniest player at West Torrens by a country mile, but he thinks Dan Fallins had him covered when he was playing. However there is nothing surer than Bailey Capel being the greatest pest at West Torrens. Even so he wasn't game to offer a reason.

- **Tiger Woods** – former world's #1 professional golfer

OBITUARY

It is with much sadness that we report the death of one of the Club's legends **Rex Blundell**. Rex died suddenly at home on November 10 when he suffered a heart attack. He served West Torrens for many years as player, captain, coach, secretary, SACA delegate, barman and committeeman. He played 185 A Grade games with West Torrens and 8 with Senior Colts plus had stints as captain of the B and D Grade teams. He represented South Australia in 24 First-class and 3 List A matches. Rex originally played for Port Adelaide but at the age of 17 was compelled to change Clubs due to residential By-Laws when his parents moved from Rosewater to Fulham.

A solidly built wicketkeeper and right-hand batter, Rex Blundell began his career with Port Adelaide playing in the B and C grades during the 1956-57 to 1958-59 seasons and culminating with selection in the A grade team for the last match of the latter season. This was what was termed the 'Bye match' which was against the Adelaide Plains Cricket Association at Mallala. (In the 1950s the SACA would program a match against a Country Association for the team having a bye in that round as a developmental exercise). As Rex's parents had moved into the West Torrens area he was compelled to transfer to the *Eagles* for the 1959-60 season.

He commenced in B grade and had a season under the guidance of Maurie Sykes. However it wasn't long before he took over the gloves from Maurie Yard in A grade where he became firmly ensconced until he decided to give up wicketkeeping when he was thirty, although continuing to play as a batsman and occasionally returning to wicketkeeping duties. Rex made his A grade debut for the *Eagles* in the first match of the 1960-61 season and after two games was then claimed by the Senior Colts team for the next eight games and returned to West Torrens for the final match when Senior Colts had the bye.

During the mid-sixties he played an occasional first-class match when state custodian Barry Jarman was on international duty but replaced Jarman permanently when the latter retired. During his 24 first class matches, he caught 64 and stumped 13 batsmen, scoring 552 runs with a top score of 66. His best performances with the gloves in a single innings (statistically) were 5c./3st. SACA XI v. S.A. Country, 7st. West Torrens v. Woodville at Woodville in 1969-70, 5c./1st. South Australia v. Queensland in 1969-70 and 4c./1st. West Torrens v. Prospect in the 1971-72 Semi-final. Rex captained the A grade for four years, the B grade for seven years, played in an A grade, a D grade and a Gillette Cup Premiership. He also coached the Club. Rex was chosen as the wicketkeeper in South Australia's

initial Limited Over match and also played twice more at a time when DLOs were played on a knock-out basis and teams often only played a solitary game each season.

He was the A grade keeper for twelve seasons and donned the gloves on occasions in two other seasons after he had handed over to the young Greg Quinn. During this time, he created a record for the most career dismissals by a West Torrens wicketkeeper, securing four more than Bert Hairfield had in the thirties and forties. It was also through his foresight (followed by some modification by another West Torrens keeper Mick Brien) that we saw the introduction of the present-day wicketkeeping pads. Keepers had originally worn heavy bulky wicketkeeping pads designed for protection rather than deft movement. In the fifties they discarded these for lighter batting pads to allow for greater agility. Rex, however believed that keepers did not need pads on good pitches – these were really only required for tracks which kept low or were conducive to producing shooters. Consequently he did not wear pads on hot days in the latter part of his Club career.



On 18 October 1969 he created a world record by stumping seven of the strong Woodville side in an innings, the first six being off the bowling of Brian Flaherty and the last from Malcolm Lewis. While such a feat depends on the spinners getting the ball past the bat, the pressure was on for the keeper to take the chances, for such an opportunity would never present itself again. He won the inaugural Charlie Walker wicketkeeping trophy (shared with John Ducker) in 1962-63 and repeated the feat in 1964-65 and 1966-67.

Rex was also a highly competitive top order batsman making two centuries, the best being 108 against Port Adelaide at Alberton in 1966-67 (I was on the receiving end as a Magpie player) but the other was his most entertaining, 103 no in 86 minutes against Kensington at Thebarton in 1963-64.

During the 1981-82 season Rex was an integral part of the D grade team, being one of three ex A-graders who teamed with a group of teenagers and which duly won the premiership. His was a unique contribution to the Club as he returned to the A grade on four occasions during the season to add experience and direction to another group of young players when five experienced players were on state duty. The following season he accepted an invitation to captain the B grade and did so for two seasons before retiring to the bar (not that of the legal profession) at age 41.

Rex was an efficient and industrious administrator, serving on the management and social committees over many years and as Secretary for four years. In the latter role he carried the major burden when the licensed clubroom was being built at Thebarton Oval. This gave the Club its own social area and assisted in recruiting new playing and non-playing members. Rex was awarded the inaugural Al Keville Trophy for club person of the year in 1981-82. It was therefore appropriate that he was the captain of the first team to play on Kings Reserve adjacent to Thebarton Oval and which had become the new home ground for the Club in October 1983. Later that season he scored the first century on Kings.

Rex was a fine man, an excellent coach and an outstanding teammate, friend & family man. He was a great supporter of the club and will be sadly missed by all at WTDCC. Our condolences to his wife, Lola and his sons, Marc and Glen and extended family & friends.
