PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The first part of 2025 has had a different feel and been a little disjointed with lots of white ball cricket, some byes or weeks off for all, and mixed formats for the Girls & Juniors. In addition to that, a lot of our elite and female male players have been away playing in the BBL/WBBL, while many of our younger players have had various representative carnivals so it's been rather tricky to keep up on where everyone is & how we are performing.

On the positive side, we had six Eagles playing in the BBL, an astonishing amount, with Harry Manenti & Jordan Buckingham making their BBL debuts late in the season for the Strikers, joining the more experience Nielsen, Johnson, Fraser-McGurk & Drew who all played games in BBL14. Unfortunately, with this exodus of skill it makes it harder to win games as we progress through the grades, but our Men's 1st & 2nd Grade, and juniors are still well within striking distance of their respective finals.

A bit closer to home, in recent weeks it's been great to see Charlie Edmunds (2nd Grade) & Seamus Keogh (1st Grade) bringing up maiden senior tons for the club.

Our Women's program has welcomed Jo Gardner, from England for the second half of the season and while our first-grade results haven't been as we'd like, our 2nd grade currently sit 2nd which shows that we are building some very good depth to help cover the absence of our elite players when they are off playing 1st Class cricket. One of those elite players, Maggie Clark, was in Malaysia as part of the 15-player squad for the 2025 ICC U19 Women's T20 World Cup.

Our Juniors continue to perform on the field and the support of many of the parents & the Junior Committee for the club this year has been excellent and while the T20 program has limited opportunities for many players to fully perform, there have been some excellent opportunities for our junior teams to watch each other in action. Another positive is the completion of the John Mitchell pitch replacement, with the first U.15.5 game being played there against Port (on the 1st/8th February).

Our Academy players and U12s have played a series of games against Woodville, Prospect & Kensington in which we won all three and played 30 different players, some excellent individual performances from Tommy, Thomas, Harvey & Harly and a big thank you to the parents & U.14/13 junior squad players who helped umpire & score throughout the games.

February sees the club host some games for the country carnival, thanks to Hutto and his helpers for opening the bar during these games and making sure Ravo and our Yorke Peninsula zone team have a great experience playing at Henley Oval.

Ella Simpson (41) and **Brianna Cheetham** (29) created a new Women's 2nd Grade 7th wicket partnership record when they added 53 v. Sturt at Price Memorial Oval, Hawthorn in Round 11. The previous best was 34 by **Brianna (116)** and **Emily Pope (5)** v. University at Henley, Oval, February 2024.

Round 5 – January 4th & 11th

Two Day – University Oval

On a wicket that had more grass coverage than we had seen for quite some time we backed ourselves to bat first knowing it would be a tough first hour but hopefully would flatten as the day went on. That tough first hour became 90 tough overs and 18 wickets fell for the day. At Stumps we were well and truly in the game having had made 169 (Manenti 57, Nielsen 41, Smith 31) and having Uni 8/104, (Hunt 3/36, Keogh 2/22 & Manenti 2/20).

They however had English cricketer and new recruit Ethan Brookes not out at the crease. When we arrived on day 2 the green pitch from the previous week was looking a lot different and it took us 2 hours to get the 9th wicket with only a 4 run lead. Frustratingly we believe we took the final week with an adjacent LBW only for it to be turned down and Uni going on to win the game by 1 wicket, Brookes 82no.

Round 6 – January 18th & 25th

Two Day – Henley Grange Memorial

TTG batted first on what looked like quite a bare wicket and with balls bouncing twice to the keeper by the third over of the day. We thought it might get tough to post a big score. To their credit TTG got to 5/290 by stumps and were clearly going use their right to bat the extra 10 overs the following week. At the end of their 100 overs they made 7/353 (Smith 3/48, Reuther 2/76) and we now had 78 overs to make 354 to win.

We didn't get off to a great start losing Smith for a duck and at 3/55 our best result was likely holding on for a draw. Some middle order hitting from Manenti 56, Nielsen 44, Butterfield 43 and Keogh with his first A grade ton – 102 n.o.

By the time we ran out of overs we were 6/282. 5 points each side.

Round 7 – February 1st & 8th

Two Day – Henley Grange Memorial

It now felt like quite a while ago that we had won a red ball game. We needed a good win to keep any chance of playing finals alive and avoiding relegation. Adelaide batted first and got off to a flyer being 0/41 off 6 overs. Good captaincy by Drew saw him make a double change and introduce spin at one end early in the game. From there we managed to bowl Adelaide out for 110 with Carson 3/22, Keogh 3/26 and Manenti 4/24.

Our turn to bat and we declared 2/190 with Capel making his first century for the season (103 n.o.) and Carson opening the batting making 67. We declared day 2 with an 80 run lead and consistently took wickets throughout the second day bowling Adelaide out in their second innings for 174. All bowled well sharing the wickets with Reuther taking 3/35. Needing 94 to win to secure a handy 30 point outright result we managed to achieve this quite comfortable being 2/96, (Coles 48 & Capel 27no). That leaves us in the top 4 with 3 tough games remaining.

Each time there are a batch of 1st Grade players absent up to six 2nd Graders have filled the vacancies with similar promotions from 3rd Grade to 2nd Grade. This then provides opportunities for some very young players who currently train with the senior squad.

The program runs as a T20 competition prior to Christmas and then increases to 30 over matches as the young players learn more skills. They often take on the 1st Grade teams from the ATCA Clubs and these Clubs usually have some very experienced players. Currently The *Sheagles Thirds* have won three, tied one and lost six.

Our latest recruit to the Women's section of the Club is Essex all-rounder Jo Gardner. Although a highly qualified University graduate (Loughborough University) with a BSc. with First Class Honours in Sport and Exercise Science, Jo has chosen to go down the path of a full-time professional cricketer in the ECB County Championship, plus the 50 over and T20 competitions.

Her cricket goes back to her early childhood when she played with her brother in the back garden and tried to hit his wayward bowling into the next-door neighbours' property, losing ample tennis balls along the way. After she viewed one of her brother's junior games, the coach asked Jo if she wanted to get involved, to which she replied in the affirmative and led to her selection in the U.11 Boys team. Progressive improvement in her game resulted in selection for the Northants junior county teams and eventually the senior side and many semi-professional and professional outfits.



Playing for Northamptonshire in 2014, as a 17 year old, she was the leading wicket-taker across the whole County [Championship](#), taking 19 wickets at an average of 9.47. She took 5/23 against both [Scotland](#) and [Hampshire](#). She hit her maiden county half-century in 2015, against [Leicestershire](#), and went on to hit three more in 2016, and was the leading run-scorer for her side in both competitions.

Jo lists as her greatest achievement in Cricket as being involved with the Sunrisers team winning the Rachael Heyhoe-Flint Trophy in 2024 English 50-over competition by defeating South-East Stars at the Grace Rd. Ground, Leicester. This was particularly exhilarating as the Sunrisers were the perennial wooden spoon winners who turned their fortunes around to become the last-ever regional winners of the Rachael Heyhoe Flint Trophy. The team had failed to win a match in the first three editions of the competition. Sunrisers were essentially a team covering the regional hub of Middlesex/Essex and Northamptonshire, but were predominantly North-London/Middlesex based and played their home games across those three counties. Her biggest thrills in cricket are always simply winning games with her teammates! However, the most notable was, being a part of the entire journey with Sunrisers from 2020 (when the team first came together) through until 2024 when they finished the season with a trophy. Further, participating in The Hundred competition since its inception has provided her with extremely memorable experiences as the atmosphere and crowds have been incomparable to anything she had ever experienced in cricket before!

Going to Loughborough University and training under notable coach in Salliann Briggs and being a part of the MCCU programme for the 3 years definitely had a massive influence on Jo's game. She feels that if she had not been a part of the program there, she wouldn't be in the position she is in today, as a professional cricketer.

This all-round sportswoman also played football (soccer), basketball and did a bit of athletics when at school – but good enough to represent the school at district and county meets. Nowadays, she likes to play the occasional round of golf as and when she can fit it in.



Jo was looking to play cricket in Australia so after playing with Amanda-Jade Wellington during The Hundred in 2024, 'Wello' directed Jo in the direction of 'Froggy' Murdoch our Club women's coach, and once contact had been made, everything came together from there!

Questions of interest posed to her brought the following responses

Who is the best batter/bowler against whom you have batted? Why?

Sophie Eccleston (England, Lancs, North-West Thunder) – her ability to change her pace without any changes to her action, as well as the bounce and turn she is able to extract makes her a difficult bowler to face!

Who is the best player against whom you have played? Why?

It probably has to be **Nat Sciver-Brunt (England, Surrey, The Blaze, Perth Scorchers)** or **Marizanne Kapp (South Africa, Oval Invincibles)** – although I have had the privilege to also play alongside both of them as well!! – because their all-round ability to deliver and execute their skills for their teams in key moments is highly impressive, as well as their consistency to do this for the last decade or so.

Funniest player with whom you currently play and Why?

Eva Gray Surrey, Sunrisers) – we have a pretty similar sense of humour and she's someone I can always rely on to make me laugh!

She was best known for being [captain of England](#) from 1966 to 1978, and was unbeaten in six [Test series](#): in total, she played for the [English women's cricket team](#) from 1960 to 1982. Heyhoe Flint was captain when her team won the inaugural [1973 Women's Cricket World](#)

[Cup](#), which England hosted.^[1] She was also the first female cricketer to hit a six in a [Test match](#), and one of the first ten women to become a member of the [MCC](#). She also played as [goalkeeper](#) for the England national [hockey](#) team in 1964. (Wikipedia)

- (2) **Salliann Beams** ([née Briggs](#); born 3 February 1984) is an English former [cricketer](#) who played over 100 times in limited overs cricket in England, primarily for [Yorkshire](#). After retiring, she worked as part of the England women development programme, in connection with the under-19s, and also worked as the head coach at [Loughborough University](#), [Loughborough Lightning](#) and Hobart Hurricanes. HISTORY CORNER

Merv Waite is the only player to make a triple century for West Torrens. He scored 339 in 434 minutes against Port Adelaide in the 1935-36 A Grade Preliminary Final at Adelaide Oval. This still remains a SACA Grade all-comers record.

Lauren Ebsary is the first to make a double century at Henley Oval and the only West Torrens woman to make a double century. She scored 202 n.o. v. Port Adelaide, October 2010 in a 50 over game. She batted at #3 not going to the wicket until the score was 48. She is also the first Eagle to score a [T20 century](#) when she scored 101 n.o. v. Tea Tree Gully at Henley Oval in February 2011. She replicated this feat with 100 n.o. (47 balls) v. Sturt at Park 25 #2, February 2014. This match was a normal scheduled Home and Away Premiership game but converted to a T20 due to the extreme heat. She added to this record with 110 n.o. (61b.) v. Port Adelaide at Col. Waite Oval, January 2016

Patrick Fisher became the first West Torrens [male](#) player to score a T20 (A Grade) century when he belted 105 n.o. (44 balls – 11x6s – 5x4s) v. Tea Tree Gully at Pertaringa Oval in December 2013. It is also the Club's fastest century in any grade. Rain stopped play after 14.3 overs.

The only other West Torrens player to surpass this feat was **David Hookes** who hit a century from 34 balls (43 minutes, 17 x 4s, 3 x 6s) in a Sheffield Shield match for [South Australia](#) v. Victoria. This is the fastest uncontrived First-Class century [ever compiled in world cricket](#). David went on to take his score to 107 from 40 balls in 49 minutes. He had also scored 137 in the first innings. 'Hookesy' was angry at Victoria's skipper Graham Yallop reneging on a promised declaration, so he thought he would 'stick it up Yallop'.

West Torrens v. Afghanistan (World Cup warm-up match)

Spencer Johnson batting for West Torrens in a friendly against World Cup contenders Afghanistan (6 Feb 2015) at Henley Oval created a sensation when facing the Afghani quick **Hamid Hassan**. Hamid thought that he had Spencer's measure but the umpire had other ideas. Firstly Hamid bowled Spencer, but it was a [no-ball](#). The next delivery was nicked onto his wicket but not out as it was a [free hit](#) resulting in 2 runs ricocheting off the stumps. Again with his next delivery Hassan knocked over the stumps but alas another [no ball](#). On the fourth delivery, another [free hit](#), the West Torrens left hander was again able to guide it onto his stumps and steal a single. Four balls – four stump 'shatterers' – four times not out – 5 runs. **Adrian Chad** who had been observing from the non-strikers end then faced Hassan next ball only to be adjudged l.b.w. to the Afghani's relief. Spencer went to bigger things with a well compiled nine.
