PRESIDENT'S REPORT

As I am writing this in late February to make the editing deadline, we are still a few weeks out from the end of the minor round for seniors, having just celebrated another white ball 1st Grade Men's Premiership, and looking forward to finals for all our boys junior teams (who all sit inside the 4 with one game to go) and the hope of perhaps one or two of our senior teams sneaking into the finals too, the only troubling issue is how our Men's 1st Grade Red Ball season will finish. Obviously, we hope our later season form continues, and we avoid relegation at worst and at best sneak into the four, where we would be a fair chance of adding more silverware. But given the vagaries of the SACA draw, points systems, by-laws, playing conditions, weather conditions, elite player availability, pitches, tosses, injuries, and luck, frankly anything is possible so hopefully we will be reading this with things having worked out well...

Thank you to Don Blairs, Mark Whenan and newly appointed board member Matt Atkinson who have been integral to the efforts on behalf of WT and a special shout out to Life Member, Daniel Lynch for chairing a meeting of some of the executive of the WTDCC & HFC boards to help with building a better relationship. Off the back of that we are planning a joint celebration on Friday 13th March to help further push the new changeroom project forward.

Matt Atkinson has secured us additional grant funding from CCS which will enable the purchase a new Super Sopper, which is long overdue. Let's hope it doesn't need to be used until next season though! We have some additional prizemoney from our recent One Day Premiership but the need for more funding to continue to pursue success and implement the programs and structures we feel will help develop our players is relentless. So we ask that you help support the club by any means available to you, be that buying Toyota "good for cricket" raffle tickets, sponsoring a ball or getting to the club for a drink over the weekend. Lastly, it was fantastic to see Harry Manenti represent himself, the club and Italy so well in the recent T20 World Cup, standing in as skipper for the majority of the games and batting well for the team on several occasions. I have been informed he's not the first Eagle to captain a World Cup team (with Jeff Crowe beating him to it for NZ in the longer format) – I'll leave that to Rocca to confirm – but it's an impressive effort and one he should be highly commended for, he's been a great addition to the Eagles nest!! Let's hope we have a couple more Eagles representing (Australia) at the next one.

1st Year player senior **Bailey Horsell** completed the first hat trick for West Torrens in C Grade for 39 seasons when he took 4/33 with his 'leggies' v. Glenelg at Henley High School in the final round. He began with a catch and bowl, followed with a catch by the keeper and completed the feat by bowling his final victim.

There have been eighth West Torrens hat tricks in C Grade since it was instituted as a SACA Grade in 1949-50. The last before Bailey's was **Shaun McMahon** who took 4/1 against Sturt at Hawthorn Oval in January 1987.

Lachlan Boylan (110) and **Ed O'Hara** (59) created a new record for a 1st wicket partnership with 183 for the Ray Sutton Shield team (U.13) against Southern District at Hackham Sports Club, on 7 February. It is also the highest ever partnership for any wicket in the RSS competition for West Torrens. The previous best have been:

1st wicket

106 James Smith (52) and Nick Gazettas (36) v. Adelaide at Glandore Oval, November 2001

2nd wicket

126* Dylan Ribbons (103 ret.) and Taylor Ford (36 n.o.) v. Woodville at Henley Oval., Nov. 2005

In the Grand Final v. Port Adelaide, **Tommy Sincok** became just the third West Torrens player to carry his bat through and innings for West Torrens U13s. The others were **Harry Russell** and **Thomas Brown**.

South Australian captain **Jemma Barsby** was awarded the WNBL Player of the Match trophy in the match v. ACT Meteors at EPC Solar Park in Canberra in February. She scored 85 from 66 balls including 8 x 4s and 2 x 6s.

Round 9 against Adelaide was a nail-biter. Brianna Cheetham's 56 off 61, alongside Mackenzie McCauley (31 off 67) and Ishmeet Kaur (24 off 51), helped us post 7/162. Cadence Murdoch (2/28 off 8) produced a superb caught and bowled, but we were unable to execute, with Adelaide finishing 5/163.

Round 10 was a dominant performance against Port Adelaide. We set 7/222, led by Mackenzie McCauley (81 off 112), Rachel Banham (41 off 55) and Cadence Murdoch (31 off 30). Two wickets apiece to Swati Alladi, Cadence Murdoch and Mackenzie McCauley restricted them to 9/113. A shoutout to Jessica Woolford (wk), who impressed with a catch, run out and stumping.

Round 11 continued the momentum with a comprehensive win over Adelaide University. We posted 7/250, powered by Brianna Cheetham (74 off 78), Bethan Ellis (38 off 34), Cadence Murdoch (25* off 20) and Natalie Mitchell (25 off 31), before Chelsea Molzer, Swati Alladi and Rachel Banham sealed the result with two wickets each.

Achievements

Sheffield Shield Winners 1909-10 West Torrens Premier Bowler 1907-08

Jack O'Connor was the first West Torrens player to play Test cricket. Previously the Club had another Test player the Club's greatest wicketkeeper Arthur 'Affie' Jarvis, but he played for Australia when the Club went under the Hindmarsh banner.

Jack O'Connor was first selected for New South Wales for the last two games of the 1904-05 season, taking fifteen wickets including 5/27 and 5/52 against Queensland at the Gabba. In 1906 he was in dispute with the Australian Board of Control when one of eleven NSW players (including test players Victor Trumper, Reg Duff, Tibby Cotter and Hanson Carter) who had, in January, clandestinely agreed to play against England with the Melbourne Cricket Club if that Club could be arrange such a tour in opposition to the Board. As the New South

Wales and Victorian Cricket Associations supported the Board, the NSWCA suspended the eleven from first class cricket. On the other hand the SA Cricket Association stood behind the MCC.

Although the suspension was lifted in August of 1906, Jack had been lured to the SACA which had decided to engage him and Arthur McBeath, who also had first class experience, as ground staff bowlers for the 1906-07 season. McBeath was to play for the District team which had finished second last on the premiership list in the previous season and his compatriot Jack O'Connor for the bottom ranked team, a system applying for the length of their contract. After Christmas McBeath was to turn out with the then fifth ranked team and O'Connor would change over to the bottom club. It was a wise move by the SACA to lure O'Connor to Adelaide as he had led the Australian first class bowling averages for the 1905-06 season with New South Wales and topped the Australian first class wicket aggregate in 1908-09 for South Australia.

Jack, a tall medium pacer with an excellent command of flight and length and a very effective outswinger, began with West Torrens and played the five matches leading up to Christmas and then had to transfer to North Adelaide for the remainder of the year as per the SACA contract. He took 8/35 against Adelaide in his last appearance with North Adelaide. In the latter part of the season he was selected to play for the Rest of Australia against New South Wales at the SCG taking a few wickets but scoring 50 n.o. The match was played as a Testimonial for former Test captain Syd Gregory who had recently been declared bankrupt.

The same criteria applied for the 1907-08 season and Jack was required to play for Port Adelaide for the first half of the season. He played three matches for the Magpies and returned to West Torrens after Christmas when available. He showed that he was unafraid of hard work as he toiled through 83 overs in the match against Victoria at the MCG. Soon after his return to the Eagles' fold, Jack was selected for the third Test against England at Adelaide Oval to replace the injured Albert 'Tibby' Cotter. O'Connor was a much different type of bowler to Cotter, the latter having a reputation for smashing stumps and scaring batsmen in his heyday. Jack took 3/110 as the first change bowler in England's first innings. Batting a second time and 78 runs in arrears, Australia lost Trumper, Macartney and McAlister while erasing the deficit. When Warwick Armstrong left at 4/127 O'Connor was called in as nightwatchman, survived until stumps and went on to make 20 the next day despite losing his captain Monty Noble soon after the start of play. His defiance set the scene for Queenslander Roger Hartigan, who was playing his first Test and Clem Hill to make centuries and steer Australia to 506. Jack dominated with the ball in England's second knock taking 5/40 from 21 overs to see Australia to victory by 245 runs.

In February 1909 the Australian selectors adopted an usual method of choosing the side to tour England in the following winter. They announced nine certainties including O'Connor and decided to play two Australia versus The Rest games at the SCG and MCG to select the remainder of the touring party. Consequently Jack played only five Club matches before Christmas and was unavailable after due to state and Australian commitments and the fact that the ship bound for England left before the completion of the Australian season. His Club performances were hardly comparable to his first-class figures. For West Torrens he took 9 wickets at 34 while at state level he dismissed 40 batsmen at an average of 23.

On tour he found the pitches too slow although he did capture 85 wickets, with a best of 7/40 and 3/85 against Derbyshire and a further ten wickets in the match against Warwickshire. He played the first Test, but that proved to be his last, as he sustained an injury from which he recovered before the end of the tour, but was unable to regain his Test place.

On his return from England he was again allocated to the Port Adelaide Club which was at the bottom of the ladder, for the first half of the 1909-10 season. However due to a sojourn in Sydney for six weeks and state commitments he did not play for the Magpies. He played for University (the lowest ranked team) which had been admitted to the competition with Glenelg the previous season, in two games near the end of the season.

Later in life he often travelled with Australian teams by ship to the U.K. As a close friend of the great Victor Trumper, Jack was a Pall bearer at Victor's funeral (Trumper d. 28 Jun 1915).
